A RESOLUTION

- 1 Extending sympathies and heartfelt condolences to the families
- of those killed and injured in the terrorist attack in Paris,
- 3 France.
- WHEREAS, On November 13, 2015, three teams of terrorists
- 5 staged coordinated attacks at six locations throughout Paris,
- 6 including a concert hall, the Stade de France and at least two
- 7 restaurants; and
- 8 WHEREAS, At least 129 people were killed and 352 people were
- 9 wounded in the attacks, with 99 of the wounded reported to be in
- 10 very serious condition; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The attacks outraged France as well as the
- 12 international community, and several vigils and rallies were
- 13 held around the United States and the world; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Pope Francis condemned the killings, saying the
- 15 attacks were part of a "piecemeal Third World War" and that
- 16 "there is no religious or human justification for it"; and
- 17 WHEREAS, President Barack Obama pledged solidarity with
- 18 France, saying that "We've seen an outrageous attempt to
- 19 terrorize innocent civilians. This is an attack on all of

- 1 humanity and the universal values we share. We stand prepared
- 2 and ready to provide whatever assistance the people of France
- 3 need to respond."; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate express its full support and
- 5 friendship to the people of France as they deal with this
- 6 tragedy; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate support France's efforts to find
- 8 the perpetrators of these crimes and bring them to justice; and
- 9 be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Senate extend sympathies and heartfelt
- 11 condolences to the families of the hundreds of people injured
- 12 and murdered in the terrorist attack; and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 14 the French Ambassador in Washington D.C.
