A RESOLUTION

Extending sympathies and heartfelt condolences to the families of those killed and injured in the terrorist attack in Paris, France.

WHEREAS, On November 13, 2015, three teams of terrorists staged coordinated attacks at six locations throughout Paris, including a concert hall, the stade de France and at least two restaurants; and

WHEREAS, At least 129 people were killed and 352 people were wounded in the attacks, with 99 of the wounded reported to be in very serious condition; and

WHEREAS, The attacks outraged France as well as the international community, and several vigils and rallies were held around the United States and the world; and

WHEREAS, Pope Francis condemned the killings, saying the attacks were part of a "piecemeal Third World War" and that "there is no religious or human justification for it"; and

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama pledged solidarity with France, saying that "We've seen an outrageous attempt to terrorize innocent civilians. This is an attack on all of
