## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2015 as "Food Pantry Donation Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Many residents of this Commonwealth are in a
- 4 continuous struggle to provide food for themselves and their
- 5 families and this struggle, also known as food insecurity, can
- 6 result in hunger, malnutrition and, in some cases, starvation;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Since the overall health of a person is dependent
- 9 upon a proper diet, hunger and malnutrition can lead to physical
- 10 and cognitive impairments in children and create a host of
- 11 health-related problems in adults; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The establishment of a network of community-based
- 13 food banks and food pantries can reduce the prevalence of food
- 14 insecurity and offset the adverse effects of hunger and
- 15 malnourishment; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Food banks and food pantries, while laudably
- 17 attempting to reduce that figure, still fall short in providing

- 1 adequate food supplies to hungry residents of this Commonwealth;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, Approximately 14% of residents of this Commonwealth
- 4 do not have a continuous, reliable and self-sustaining pathway
- 5 to a food bank or food pantry, and 39% of these households have
- 6 a child under 18 years of age; and
- WHEREAS, Charitable food organizations, including food banks
- 8 and food pantries, have responded to food insecurity in this
- 9 Commonwealth by accepting food donations and providing hot
- 10 meals, groceries and information on government assistance
- 11 programs to at-risk adults and families; and
- 12 WHEREAS, A greater public awareness of food insecurity and
- 13 the impact food insecurity has on the residents of this
- 14 Commonwealth is essential to encourage donations to local food
- 15 banks and pantries in this Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Nearly 25 years ago, the General Assembly amended
- 17 the Judicial Code to provide for reduced liability for damages
- 18 from donated food and grocery products; and
- 19 WHEREAS, This "Good Samaritan" provision, under 42 Pa.C.S. §
- 20 8338, allows for restaurants, grocery stores and other entities
- 21 that produce and sell food to donate their excess to food banks
- 22 and, unless negligence or willful provision of expired food can
- 23 be proven, to be held free of liability in a civil lawsuit if a
- 24 person should unfortunately become ill from the donated food;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, Because of the excess of consumable food being
- 27 disposed while our friends and neighbors starve, it is necessary
- 28 to draw attention to this provision in the Judicial Code and
- 29 encourage businesses such as restaurants to take advantage of
- 30 "Good Samaritan" provisions to reduce their food waste and help

- 1 feed our communities; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of November
- 3 2015 as "Food Pantry Donation Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 4 further
- 5 RESOLVED, That restaurants and grocery stores consider
- 6 donating excess food and grocery products to charitable food
- 7 organizations, including food banks and food pantries.
