A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of December 7 through 13, 2015, as "Government Reform Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Residents of this Commonwealth expect and deserve a
4	more accountable, efficient, transparent, fiscally responsible
5	and effective government; and
6	WHEREAS, The Center for Public Integrity's State Integrity
7	Investigation, released in November 2015, ranked Pennsylvania
8	45th in the country in government integrity, and Pennsylvania
9	was one of 11 states that received a failing grade; and
10	WHEREAS, Pennsylvania received failing grades in seven
11	subtopics, including political financing, electoral oversight,
12	legislative accountability, judicial accountability, State civil
13	service management, ethics enforcement agencies and State
14	pension fund management; and
15	WHEREAS, The failing grades marked a slide for Pennsylvania
16	from the 20th place ranking for the Commonwealth earned in a
17	similar assessment published in 2012; and
18	WHEREAS, A positive assessment in the report for Pennsylvania

is the Commonwealth's 4th place ranking for laws and processes 1 2 that provide public access to government records; and 3 WHEREAS, While the Commonwealth's 4th place national ranking shows that progress has been made in the area of government 4 transparency, the grade received by Pennsylvania indicates that 5 6 the effort to improve government transparency must continue; and 7 WHEREAS, Based on a published academic study, Americans are 8 most concerned about corruption of government officials; and 9 WHEREAS, The findings of this study, published by Chapman 10 University, emphasize that reform is not a choice, but a 11 necessity; and

12 WHEREAS, "Government Reform Week" is a time to take stock of 13 the function of State government over the past year, while 14 looking forward to the reforms that should be enacted in the 15 next year; therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of December 7 17 through 13, 2015, as "Government Reform Week" in Pennsylvania.
