- 7 officers who died in 2015: Police Officer Lloyd E. Reed, Jr.,
- 8 St. Clair Township Police Department, Patrolman John James
- 9 Wilding, Scranton Police Department, Lieutenant Eric Alan
- 10 Eslary, Ligonier Township Police Department, Detective Paul John
- 11 Koropal, Allegheny County District Attorney's Office and
- 12 Sergeant Robert Francis Wilson, III, Philadelphia Police
- 13 Department; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Sergeant Sheryl A. Pierce, South Londonderry Police
- 15 Department, passed away in September 2013 as a result of a duty-
- 16 related illness; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Across the United States, the week of May 15 through
- 2 21, 2016, is being recognized as "National Police Week"; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The first "National Police Officers' Memorial Day"
- 4 was held on May 15, 1982, following a proclamation signed by
- 5 President John F. Kennedy on October 1, 1962; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The observance has continued to be held annually in
- 7 memory of those police officers who have made the ultimate
- 8 sacrifice in the line of duty; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the memory of the hundreds of
- 10 police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty
- 11 in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of May 15
- 13 through 21, 2016, as "National Police Week" and May 2, 2016, as
- 14 "Police Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
