A RESOLUTION

- Designating May 17, 2016, as "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 Información fecimology Awareness Day In Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, United States health care spending grew 5.3% in
- 4 2014, reaching \$3 trillion or \$9,523 per person, according to
- 5 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; and
- 6 WHEREAS, As a share of the nation's Gross Domestic Product,
- 7 health spending accounted for 17.5% in 2014; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Spending on health care has risen over 40% in the
- 9 last decade; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The health care industry could save over \$8 billion
- 11 annually by completely switching from paper-based to electronic
- 12 transactions; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The health care industry invests only 5% of its
- 14 revenue on information technology and management systems versus
- 15 10.5% of other data-intensive industries, such as banking; and
- 16 WHEREAS, A recent study by the Commonwealth Fund has
- 17 demonstrated that the use of automated clinical decision support

- 1 systems can result in a net reduction of \$538 per patient per
- 2 hospital stay; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine reports there are at least
- 4 1.5 million preventable adverse drug events per year, each
- 5 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 7 reports that, between 2011 and 2015, 50,607 providers and
- 8 facilities in Pennsylvania received \$1.4 billion in Federal
- 9 incentive payments to implement electronic health records; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Ninety-seven percent of eligible hospitals and 56%
- 11 of ambulatory health care providers in Pennsylvania have
- 12 adopted, upgraded or demonstrated meaningful use of an
- 13 electronic health record system in 2015; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth report an
- 15 improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of medical
- 16 school when advanced information technology is deployed at their
- 17 sites; and
- 18 WHEREAS, In 2012, Senate Bill 8 was signed into law, enacting
- 19 the Pennsylvania eHealth Information Technology Act and
- 20 establishing the Pennsylvania eHealth Partnership Authority and
- 21 a health information exchange; and
- 22 WHEREAS, By 2015, four of this Commonwealth's health
- 23 information organizations signed agreements to join the
- 24 Pennsylvania eHealth Partnership Authority's Pennsylvania
- 25 Patient and Provider Network, a critical step toward a Statewide
- 26 health information exchange; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Supporters and members of the Healthcare Information
- 28 and Management Systems Society encourage the continued funding
- 29 of operations to support the ongoing advancement of a Statewide
- 30 health information exchange; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 17, 2016, as
- 2 "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day"
- 3 in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the importance of raising
- 5 awareness of health care information technology and the
- 6 advancement of the health information exchange to help improve
- 7 the quality of care, save lives and reduce the cost of health
- 8 care for all Pennsylvanians; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate welcome members and supporters of
- 10 the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society to the
- 11 State Capitol to promote better health care in this Commonwealth
- 12 through broader adoption of health care information technology
- 13 and the advancement of a Statewide health information exchange.
