INTRODUCED AND ADOPTED, MAY 18, 2016

A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of June 1 through 7, 2016, as "Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Automated External 2 Defibrillator Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is one of the leading 4 causes of death in the United States, affecting more than 5 325,000 individuals of every age each year; and WHEREAS, SCA is an electrical malfunction in the heart that 7 8 causes an irregular heartbeat, or arrhythmia, and disrupts the flow of blood to the brain, the heart and the rest of the body; 10 and WHEREAS, When an individual has SCA, the individual's heart 11 12 can suddenly and unexpectedly stop beating; and 13 WHEREAS, Survival of SCA depends upon immediate bystander
- 14 intervention, including calling 911 and beginning hands-only
- 15 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or treating the victim with
- an automated external defibrillator (AED), if available; and 16
- 17 WHEREAS, CPR is a lifesaving technique that can be performed

- 1 by pressing hard and fast on the center of the victim's chest at
- 2 a rate of 100 beats per minute; and
- 3 WHEREAS, CPR, when performed immediately, can double or
- 4 triple a cardiac arrest victim's chance of survival; and
- 5 WHEREAS, AEDs are portable electronic medical devices that
- 6 automatically diagnose life-threatening cardiac arrhythmia in
- 7 patients; and
- 8 WHEREAS, AEDs produce a shock that corrects the arrhythmia,
- 9 allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm, a process
- 10 called defibrillation; and
- 11 WHEREAS, All first response vehicles, including ambulances,
- 12 law enforcement vehicles and many fire engines, should carry an
- 13 AED; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Placing AEDs in optimal public locations where large
- 15 groups of people gather, regardless of age or activity, allows
- 16 one to be available in case of an SCA emergency; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Emergency response providers and bystanders are
- 18 afforded good samaritan civil immunity when attempting to save a
- 19 life with an AED; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Only one-third of SCA victims receive CPR from
- 21 bystanders and fewer than 5% are treated with AEDs before
- 22 emergency personnel arrive at the scene, resulting in a survival
- 23 rate of only 11%; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Individuals can be proactive by taking a course from
- 25 the American Heart Association, the American Red Cross or a
- 26 local health training agency to learn how to perform CPR and use
- 27 an AED; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Given that a person's chance of surviving an SCA
- 29 increases tremendously with the knowledge and use of both CPR
- 30 and an AED, it is vitally important that the public be aware of

- 1 their importance and their use in saving lives; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of June 1
- 3 through 7, 2016, as "Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Automated
- 4 External Defibrillator Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
