A RESOLUTION

- Designating November 18, 2016, as "Gifted Education Day" in Pennsylvania and expressing appreciation to educators of the
- gifted throughout this Commonwealth.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Association for Gifted Education,
- 5 (PAGE) originated at a conference on gifted children and youth
- 6 held in State College, Pennsylvania, in May 1951; and
- WHEREAS, The conference was organized by Margaret A. Neuber,
- 8 Chairperson of the Special Education Department at The
- 9 Pennsylvania State University, and Dr. Hedwig O. Pregler,
- 10 Principal of Colfax School in Pittsburgh, who were pioneers in
- 11 the field of gifted education; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The conference led to the establishment of the
- 13 Pennsylvania Association for the Study and Education of the
- 14 Mentally Gifted in May 1952; and
- WHEREAS, On September 24, 1977, the name of the organization
- 16 was changed to the Pennsylvania Association for Gifted
- 17 Education; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The mission of PAGE is to empower educators and

- 1 parents to meet the diverse needs of gifted learners through
- 2 awareness, advocacy and action; and
- 3 WHEREAS, PAGE is a nonprofit advocacy organization dedicated
- 4 to helping gifted learners, parents and educators; and
- 5 WHEREAS, PAGE has endeavored to contribute to the educational
- 6 needs of gifted children in a number of ways; and
- 7 WHEREAS, PAGE holds conferences on an annual basis; and
- 8 WHEREAS, PAGE has sought to influence the Department of
- 9 Education and the General Assembly regarding regulations and
- 10 legislation on behalf of education for gifted students; and
- 11 WHEREAS, PAGE members have sought to encourage local boards
- 12 of education and administrators to develop and expand programs
- 13 for gifted education; and
- 14 WHEREAS, PAGE has been a longtime affiliate of the National
- 15 Association for Gifted Children; and
- 16 WHEREAS, PAGE celebrated its 50th anniversary at the April
- 17 2001 PAGE conference in Harrisburg by inviting many former PAGE
- 18 presidents and leaders in gifted education, focusing on building
- 19 for the future and honoring the work of the past; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Since approximately 1998, PAGE has continually
- 21 advocated with determination and persuasiveness for the
- 22 Department of Education to institute and enforce school district
- 23 compliance with 22 Pa. Code Ch. 16 regulations relating to
- 24 special education for gifted students; and
- 25 WHEREAS, In 2004, PAGE board members assisted the Department
- 26 of Education in the development and completion of the Department
- 27 of Education's Gifted Education Guidelines; and
- 28 WHEREAS, These guidelines have played an important role in
- 29 the development and implementation of school district programs
- 30 for gifted students across this Commonwealth and are used by

- 1 other state education agencies as a model for gifted program
- 2 policy and practice; and
- 3 WHEREAS, PAGE holds a yearly conference, the location of
- 4 which alternates among three areas of the State; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The annual conferences have become the leading
- 6 educational and networking events for gifted education for
- 7 parents and teachers in this Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The conferences feature nationally recognized
- 9 experts in the field of gifted education and knowledgeable State
- 10 presenters, who disseminate information to school district
- 11 personnel, parents and teachers for the betterment of gifted
- 12 students in this Commonwealth; and
- 13 WHEREAS, PAGE conferences are well respected and renowned
- 14 across the nation; and
- 15 WHEREAS, PAGE holds an annual training weekend for local
- 16 affiliate group leaders from across this Commonwealth to educate
- 17 them about relevant gifted issues and to provide leadership
- 18 training; therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate November 18, 2016, as
- 20 "Gifted Education Day" in Pennsylvania and express appreciation
- 21 to educators of the gifted throughout this Commonwealth.
