A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of November 2016 as "Food Pantry Donation Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Many residents of this Commonwealth are in a
4	continuous struggle to provide food for themselves and their
5	families and this struggle, also known as food insecurity, can
6	result in hunger, malnutrition and, in some cases, starvation;
7	and
8	WHEREAS, Since the overall health of a person is dependent
9	upon a proper diet, hunger and malnutrition can lead to physical
10	and cognitive impairments in children and create a host of
11	health-related problems in adults; and
12	WHEREAS, The establishment of a network of community-based
13	food banks and food pantries can reduce the prevalence of food
14	insecurity and offset the adverse effects of hunger and
15	malnourishment; and
16	WHEREAS, Food banks and food pantries, while laudably

17 attempting to reduce that figure, still fall short in providing

1 adequate food supplies to hungry residents of this Commonwealth;
2 and

3 WHEREAS, Charitable food organizations, including food banks 4 and food pantries, have responded to food insecurity in this 5 Commonwealth by accepting food donations and providing hot 6 meals, groceries and information on government assistance 7 programs to at-risk adults and families; and

8 WHEREAS, A greater public awareness of food insecurity and 9 the impact food insecurity has on the residents of this 10 Commonwealth is essential to encourage donations to local food 11 banks and pantries in this Commonwealth; and

12 WHEREAS, Nearly 25 years ago, the General Assembly amended 13 the Judicial Code to provide for reduced liability for damages 14 from donated food and grocery products; and

15 WHEREAS, This "Good Samaritan" provision, under 42 Pa.C.S. § 16 8338, allows for restaurants, grocery stores and other entities 17 that produce and sell food to donate their excess to food banks 18 and, unless negligence or willful provision of expired food can 19 be proven, to be held free of liability in a civil lawsuit if a 20 person should unfortunately become ill from the donated food; 21 and

22 WHEREAS, Because of the excess of consumable food being 23 disposed while our friends and neighbors starve, it is necessary 24 to draw attention to this provision in the Judicial Code and 25 encourage businesses such as restaurants to take advantage of 26 "Good Samaritan" provisions to reduce their food waste and help 27 feed our communities; therefore be it

28 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of November 29 2016 as "Food Pantry Donation Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it 30 further
