AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, further
- providing for money of authority and for transfer of existing
- facilities to authority and providing for sale or transfer of
- authority water or sewer infrastructure.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Sections 5612(b) and 5613(b) of Title 53 of the
- 9 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 10 § 5612. Money of authority.
- 11 * * *
- 12 (b) Report.--[Every authority whose fiscal year ends
- 13 December 31 shall file on or before July 1 an annual report of
- 14 its fiscal affairs covering the preceding calendar year with the
- 15 Department of Community and Economic Development and with the
- 16 municipality creating the authority on forms prepared and
- 17 distributed by the Department of Community and Economic
- 18 Development. Authorities whose fiscal year does not end on
- 19 December 31 shall file the report within 90 days after the end

- 1 of their fiscal year.]
- 2 (1) Every authority shall file, on or before 180 days
- following the end of its fiscal year, an annual report of its
- 4 <u>fiscal affairs covering the preceding fiscal year with the</u>
- 5 <u>Department of Community and Economic Development and with the</u>
- 6 <u>municipality or municipalities creating the authority on</u>
- 7 <u>forms prepared and distributed by the Department of Community</u>
- 8 and Economic Development. The report shall also be provided, <--
- 9 <u>and may be provided electronically, to any other municipality</u>
- 10 that has customers served by the authority. THE REPORT SHALL <--
- 11 ALSO BE POSTED ON THE AUTHORITY'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE
- 12 INTERNET WEBSITE. IF THE AUTHORITY DOES NOT MAINTAIN A
- 13 PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE, THE REPORT SHALL BE
- 14 PROVIDED BY ELECTRONIC OR OTHER MEANS TO ANY OTHER
- 15 MUNICIPALITY THAT HAS CUSTOMERS SERVED BY THE AUTHORITY.
- 16 <u>(2)</u> Every authority shall have its books, accounts and
- 17 records audited annually by a certified public accountant,
- and a copy of his audit report shall be filed in the same
- 19 manner and within the same time period as the annual report.
- 20 A concise financial statement shall be published annually at
- 21 least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the
- 22 municipality where the principal office of the authority is
- located. If the publication is not made by the authority, the
- 24 municipality shall publish such statement at the expense of
- 25 the authority. If the authority fails to make such an audit,
- then the controller, auditor or accountant designated by the
- 27 municipality is hereby authorized and empowered from time to
- time to examine at the expense of the authority the accounts
- and books of it, including its receipts, disbursements,
- 30 contracts, leases, sinking funds, investments and any other

- 1 matters relating to its finances, operation and affairs.

- 3 § 5613. Transfer of existing facilities to authority.
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- 5 (b) Acquisition.--
- 6 An authority may not acquire by any device or means, 7 including a consolidation, merger, purchase or lease or 8 through the purchase of stock, bonds or other securities, 9 title to or possession or use of all or a substantial portion of any existing facilities constituting a project [as defined 10 11 under this chapter] if the project is subject to the 12 jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission 13 without first reporting to and advising the municipality 14 which created or which are members of the authority of the 15 agreement to acquire, including all its terms and conditions.
 - (2) The proposed action of the authority and the proposed agreement to acquire shall be approved by the governing body of the municipality which created or which are members of the authority and to which the report is made.

 Where there are one or two member municipalities of the authority, such approval shall be by two-thirds vote of all of the members of the governing body or of each of the governing bodies. If there are more than two member municipalities of the authority, approval shall be by majority vote of all the members of each governing body of two-thirds of the member municipalities.
 - (3) An authority may not acquire by a device or means, including a consolidation, merger, purchase or lease or through the purchase of stock, bonds or other security, title to or possession or use of all or a substantial portion of a

- 2 <u>discussed the acquisition at a public meeting and the written</u>
- 3 minutes of the meeting contain details relating to the
- 4 <u>anticipated or projected public benefit that will be realized</u>
- 5 by the acquisition. For purposes of this paragraph, a public
- 6 <u>benefit may include rate reduction, improved service quality,</u>
- 7 <u>rate stabilization, improved service reliability, action</u>
- 8 <u>resulting from an agreement with a Federal or State</u>
- 9 <u>regulatory agency or other clearly defined benefit to a</u>
- 10 <u>ratepayer of the authority.</u>

- 12 Section 2. Title 53 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 13 § 5613.1. Sale or transfer of authority water or sewer
- <u>infrastructure.</u>
- 15 (a) Prohibition. -- An authority may not sell or transfer
- 16 <u>title to all or a portion of the water or sewer infrastructure</u>
- 17 of the authority, unless the authority has discussed the sale or
- 18 transfer at a public meeting and the written minutes of the
- 19 meeting contain details relating to the anticipated or projected
- 20 public benefit that will be realized by the sale or transfer.
- 21 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "public
- 22 benefit" may include a rate reduction, improved service quality,
- 23 rate stabilization, improved service reliability, action
- 24 resulting from an agreement with a Federal or State regulatory
- 25 agency or other clearly defined benefit to a ratepayer of the
- 26 authority.
- 27 Section 3. The addition of 53 Pa.C.S. § 5613(b)(3) shall
- 28 apply to title to or possession or use of all or a substantial
- 29 portion of a facility constituting a project which is acquired
- 30 on or after the effective date of this section.

- 1 Section 4. The addition of 53 Pa.C.S. § 5613.1 shall apply
- 2 to the sale or transfer of title to all or a portion of the
- 3 water or sewer infrastructure sold or transferred on or after
- 4 the effective date of this section.
- 5 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
