- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in riot, disorderly conduct and
- related offenses, further providing for the offense of
- 4 cruelty to animals.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 5511(q) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions and the
- 9 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 10 § 5511. Cruelty to animals.
- 11 * * *
- 12 (p.1) Immunity.--A licensed doctor of veterinary medicine,
- 13 certified veterinary technician or veterinary assistant who
- 14 reports, in good faith and in the normal course of business, a
- 15 suspected incident of animal cruelty to the proper authority
- 16 shall be immune from liability in a civil action brought against
- 17 the licensed doctor of veterinary medicine, certified veterinary

- 1 <u>technician or veterinary assistant for reporting the incident.</u>
- 2 (q) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 3 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 subsection:

- 6 <u>"Certified veterinary technician."</u> As defined in section
- 7 <u>3(13) of the act of December 27, 1974 (P.L.995, No.326), known</u>
- 8 <u>as the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act.</u>

- "Licensed doctor of veterinary medicine." As defined in
- 11 <u>section 3(8) of the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act.</u>

- 13 "Veterinary assistant." As defined in section 3(14) of the

- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
