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AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled

"An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, 5 Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of 6 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring 7 registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the revocation or suspension of certain licenses and 9 registrations; and repealing an act," further providing for 10 professional prescription, administration, and dispensing. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 13 14 Section 1. Section 11(a) and (b) of the act of April 14, 15 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, are amended to read: 16 17 Section 11. Professional Prescription, Administration, and 18 Dispensing. -- (a) Except when dispensed or administered directly 19 to the patient by a practitioner or his authorized agent, other than a pharmacist, to an ultimate user, no controlled substance 20 in Schedule II[,] may be dispensed without [the written] an 21

- 1 <u>electronic</u> prescription of a practitioner, except in emergency
- 2 situations, as prescribed by the secretary by regulation. No
- 3 prescription for a controlled substance in Schedule II may be
- 4 refilled.
- 5 (b) Except when dispensed directly by a practitioner, other
- 6 than a pharmacist, to an ultimate user, no controlled substance
- 7 in Schedule III or IV[,] may be dispensed without [a written or
- 8 oral] <u>an electronic</u> prescription <u>of a practitioner</u>, except in
- 9 <u>emergency situations</u>, as prescribed by the secretary by
- 10 <u>regulation</u>. Such prescriptions shall not be filled or refilled
- 11 more than six months after the date thereof or be refilled more
- 12 than five times after the date of the prescription unless
- 13 renewed by the practitioner.

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
