9	Section 1. The act of July 14, 1961 (P.L.604, No.304), known
10	as The Apprenticeship and Training Act, is repealed:

17	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
18	hereby enacts as follows:
19	Section 1. Declaration of PolicyIt is declared to be the

policy of this act, (1) to encourage the development of an 1 2 apprenticeship and training system through the voluntary 3 cooperation of management and labor and interested State agencies and in cooperation with other states and the Federal 4 Government; (2) to provide for the establishment and furtherance 5 6 of standards of apprenticeship and training to safeguard the welfare of apprentices and trainees; (3) to aid in providing 7 8 maximum opportunities for unemployed and employed persons to improve and modernize their work skills; and (4) to contribute 9 10 to a healthy economy by aiding in the development and maintenance of a skilled labor force sufficient in numbers and 11 12 quality to meet the expanding needs of Pennsylvania industry and 13 to attract new industry.

14 Section 2. Short Title.--This act shall be known and may be 15 cited as "The Apprenticeship and Training Act."

16 Section 3. State Apprenticeship and Training Council.--There 17 is hereby created a State Apprenticeship and Training Council 18 (hereinafter called "The Council") as a departmental agency in 19 the Department of Labor and Industry to be composed of eleven 20 members who shall be appointed by the Governor. Four members 21 shall be representatives of employes and four members shall be representatives of employers and three members shall be 22 representatives of the general public. Members of the council, 23 other than the ex-officio members, shall be appointed for a term 24 25 of four years and until their successors are appointed, except 26 that two of the original members shall be appointed for a term 27 of one year, two for a term of two years, and two for a term of 28 three years, and two for a term of four years. Members of the 29 council shall be eligible for reappointment. In case of a 30 vacancy, the Governor shall make an appointment for the

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unexpired term. A Deputy Secretary of the Department of Labor 1 and Industry, the Director of the State Employment Service of 2 the Bureau of Employment Security of the Department of Labor and 3 4 Industry, the Executive Director of the Advisory Board on Problems of Older Workers of the Department of Labor and 5 6 Industry, and the Coordinator of Industrial Education of the Department of Public Instruction, and Chief of the Bureau of 7 Rehabilitation of the Department of Labor and Industry, shall be 8 9 ex-officio members of the council but shall not be entitled to 10 vote, except that in the event of a tie vote, the Deputy 11 Secretary of Labor and Industry shall have the right to cast the 12 tie-breaking vote. The council shall organize immediately upon its appointment, and annually thereafter, by the election of one 13 of its members as chairman and another as vice-chairman, one of 14 15 whom shall be a representative of employes and the other a 16 representative of employers. Each member of the State Apprenticeship and Training Council, except ex-officio members, 17 18 shall receive actual traveling expenses and per diem 19 compensation at the rate of twenty-five dollars (\$25) per day 20 for the time actually devoted to the business of the council. Section 4. Powers and Duties. -- (a) The council shall (1) 21 22 establish standards for apprenticeship in conformity with the provisions of this act and applicable statutes and regulations 23 24 of the Federal Government; (2) adopt such rules and regulations, 25 subject only to the approval of the Secretary of Labor and 26 Industry, as may be necessary to carry out the intent and 27 purpose of this act; (3) compile such data on population and 28 employment trends, industrial production, vocational and 29 industrial education and job requirements as may be deemed 30 necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this act; (4)

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to terminate or cancel any apprenticeship agreements in 1 accordance with the provisions of such agreements or order 2 modifications of such agreements; (5) maintain close liaison 3 4 with Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, the United States Department of Labor, the State Board of Vocational Education, 5 6 the Department of Public Instruction, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Rehabilitation of the Department of Labor 7 and Industry, and Juvenile Forestry Camps under the Department 8 of Public Welfare, and such other agencies which carry on 9 10 programs closely related to the purposes of this act; (6) 11 conduct studies, surveys and investigations of the special 12 problems of retraining or training unemployed or employed persons to improve or modernize work skills and make appropriate 13 14 recommendations to cooperating agencies described above, local 15 community organizations, local school boards and the Secretary of Labor and Industry; (7) act as a convening agency in local 16 communities to bring together local representatives of employes, 17 18 employers, educational agencies and industrial development 19 agencies in order to promote closer local cooperation in 20 establishing better apprenticeship and other training programs 21 including programs for employed persons who wish to improve and 22 modernize their work skills; (8) use appropriate media of 23 information and education to acquaint employers, employes and 24 the public at large with the advantages and availability of 25 apprenticeship and other occupational training programs; (9) 26 study the effectiveness of apprenticeship agreements and make 27 recommendations in accordance with the provisions of such agreements for their improvement; and (10) perform such other 28 duties as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions 29 of this act. 30

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1 The council shall make a report to the Secretary of the (b) 2 Department of Labor and Industry, on or before February 3 fifteenth, each year, indicating the extent of apprenticeship and other occupational training programs during the previous 4 year, trends in employment requiring adjustments in 5 apprenticeship training and other occupational programs, needs 6 for expansion of apprenticeship and other occupational training 7 8 programs, activities of the council and such recommendations as are in accord with the purposes of this act. 9

10 (c) No action affecting the status of an agreement shall be 11 taken by the council until an attempt has been made to bring the 12 employes and employer together to settle the problem in 13 conformity with the standards of the council.

Section 5. Meetings.--Meetings of the council shall be held 14 monthly and as often as is necessary in the opinion of the 15 16 majority of the council. The chairman shall designate the time 17 and place of the meetings and the secretary shall notify all council members at least one week in advance of each meeting. A 18 19 majority of the voting membership of the council shall 20 constitute a quorum if at least one representative from both the 21 employe and employer groups is present.

22 Section 6. Administration. -- The Secretary of the Department of Labor and Industry shall appoint a Director of Apprenticeship 23 and Training who shall be responsible to the Secretary of Labor 24 and Industry in carrying out the provisions of this act and who 25 26 shall serve as ex-officio secretary of the council. The 27 Secretary of the Department of Labor and Industry is authorized to appoint or make available to the Director of Apprenticeship 28 29 and Training such clerical, technical and professional services necessary to the performance of his duties. 30

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1 Section 7. Director Duties .-- The Director of Apprenticeship and Training shall carry out the purposes of this act. His 2 duties shall include, but shall not be limited to, (1) 3 4 encouragement and promotion of the standards established in accordance with this act and with the basic standards of the 5 6 Federal Committee on Apprenticeship; (2) bringing about the settlement of differences arising out of apprenticeship 7 agreements when the differences cannot be adjusted locally or in 8 accordance with established trade procedure; (3) supervision of 9 10 the execution of agreements and maintenance of standards; (4) 11 registration of apprenticeship agreements as the council shall 12 authorize as conforming to the established standards; (5) keeping a record of apprenticeship agreements and, upon 13 performance thereof, issuing certificates of completion of 14 15 apprenticeship; (6) execution of the actions of the council in 16 all of its powers and duties under section 4 of this act; (7) encouragement of liaison and cooperation between all private, 17 18 State and Federal agencies concerned with apprenticeship, trade 19 and industrial training; (8) promotion of employe, employer and 20 public awareness of apprenticeship and other occupational 21 training; and (9) keeping a record of the progress of 22 apprenticeship and training programs initiated in accordance with the provisions of this act and informing the council 23 24 periodically as to the results.

Section 8. Limitation.--The provisions of this act shall apply only to persons, copartnerships, associations, corporations and political subdivisions, and employer associations or organizations or associations of employes as voluntarily elect to conform with its provisions. Section 9. General Repeal.--All acts or parts of acts
