## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, further providing for alcohol, chemical and tobacco abuse program.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1547 of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
12	amended to read:
13	Section 1547. Alcohol, [Chemical and] Tobacco and Other Drug
14	Abuse Program(a) Beginning with school year 1991-1992 and
15	each year thereafter, each public school student shall receive
16	mandatory instruction in alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco <u>and</u>
17	other drug abuse in every year in every grade from kindergarten
18	through grade twelve. The instruction shall be integrated within
19	the health course of study required in accordance with the State

Board of Education regulations. In grades where health is 1 2 offered, instruction may also be integrated into other 3 appropriate courses of study. In grades where health is not offered, instruction shall be integrated into an appropriate 4 curriculum requirement as listed in 22 Pa. Code § 5.4(b). 5 This instruction: 6 (1)7 (i) Shall be age appropriate. 8 (ii) Shall be sequential in method of study. 9 (iii) Shall discourage the use of alcohol, tobacco and 10 controlled substances. 11 [(iv) Shall communicate that the use of illicit drugs and 12 the improper use of legally obtained drugs is wrong.] 13 (v) Shall create a program with the goal of reducing or 14 eliminating the incidence and prevalence of student alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse. 15 16 (vi) Shall communicate opioid abuse prevention, with an emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection 17 18 between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs, 19 including heroin. 20 (vii) Shall increase the knowledge and skills of students for avoiding the harmful effects of alcohol, tobacco and other 21 22 drug use. 23 (2)[School districts] Each school district may provide a\_ 24 comprehensive program of prevention and may utilize any 25 appropriate public or private materials, personnel and other 26 resources in developing and implementing this program of 27 instruction[.] and prevention. School districts are encouraged 28 to use interactive materials to maximize group interactions with 29 prevention programs with the involvement of community components including, but not limited to, the use of self-help groups. The 30

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Department of [Health, Office of] Drug and Alcohol Programs, 1 2 shall make available information about appropriate curriculum 3 materials and the creation of a comprehensive program of prevention upon request of a school district. In developing its 4 alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco and other drug abuse 5 instructional program, each school district shall consult with 6 the single county authority designated by the Department of 7 8 [Health] Drug and Alcohol Programs to provide drug and alcohol services in the school district's area. 9

10 (b) Each school district is hereby authorized to develop and offer programs relating to alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco and 11 other drug abuse for parents of students enrolled in the public 12 13 schools. If a school district does develop such programs, they 14 shall be developed in consultation with the single county 15 authority designated by the Department of [Health] Drug and 16 Alcohol Programs to provide drug and alcohol services in the school district's area. Such programs shall be offered at no 17 18 cost to parents.

(c) The Secretary of Education, in consultation with the Secretary of [Health] <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u>, shall develop curriculum guidelines for instruction on alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco <u>and other drug</u> abuse and the laws governing their use and misuse. These guidelines shall encourage the inclusion of the following elements where appropriate in the instruction:

(1) Detailed factual information regarding the physiological, psychological, sociological and legal aspects of substance abuse.

(2) Detailed information regarding the availability of help
and assistance for students and their families with alcohol,
[chemical and] tobacco <u>and other drug</u> dependency problems,

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1 including prescription opioid abuse.

2 (3) The goals of quality education as set forth in 22 Pa.
3 Code § 5.13(f).

4 (4) Skills needed to evaluate advertisements for and media
5 portrayals of alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco <u>and other drug</u>
6 products.

7 (5) Detailed instruction on the need for and the role of
8 lawful authority and law-abiding behavior, including interaction
9 with members of the legal and justice community.

10 Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year and each year (d) thereafter, the Secretary of Education, in consultation with the 11 12 Secretary of [Health] Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall make 13 available, to all school districts and intermediate units, in-14 service training programs based upon the instruction requirements established in subsection (a) and the curriculum 15 16 quidelines established in subsection (c). The programs shall provide preparation for the teaching of mandated instruction in 17 18 alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco and other drug abuse. The in-19 service programs may utilize the single county authorities 20 designated by the Department of [Health] Drug and Alcohol 21 Programs or such other institutions, agencies or persons as the 22 Secretary of Education deems appropriate.

23 (e) Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year, each school 24 district shall provide, as part of its in-service training, 25 programs on alcohol, drugs, tobacco and dangerous controlled 26 substances for all instructors whose teaching responsibilities include courses of study in which mandated instruction 27 28 concerning alcohol, [chemical and] tobacco and other drug abuse 29 is integrated. To comply with this requirement, a school 30 district may utilize the programs made available by the

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1 Department of Education or use other alternative programs.

2 The governing board of each intermediate unit in which a (f) 3 nonpublic school is located shall have the authority and the duty to loan to all students attending nonpublic schools within 4 the intermediate unit all educational materials developed by 5 either the Department of Education or the Department of [Health] 6 7 Drug and Alcohol Programs, pursuant to this act for the 8 instruction of public school students on the nature and effects of drugs, alcohol, tobacco and dangerous controlled substances. 9 10 Local school boards need not expend funds which are not provided by either the Federal or State Government for drug education 11 12 programs for the use or loan of these materials. A nonpublic 13 school may utilize the in-service training programs made 14 available by the Department of Education through the intermediate unit. 15

(g) On or before June 1, 1991, the Secretary of Education shall recommend to the General Assembly a plan to require and assist each school district to establish and maintain a program to provide appropriate counseling and support services to students who experience problems related to the use of drugs, alcohol and dangerous controlled substances.

[(h) On or before June 1, 1992, the Secretary of Education shall report to the General Assembly concerning the 1991-1992 school year activities of the Department of Education pertaining to the provisions of this section and concerning proposed 1992-1993 school year activities of the Department of Education pertaining to this section.]

(h.1) By June 1, 2019, and by June 1 every fifth year
 thereafter, the Department of Education, in consultation with
 the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall report to the

2	of the Department of Education and the Department of Drug and
3	Alcohol Programs pertaining to the provisions of this section.
4	The report shall include:
5	(1) A plan to assist school districts in establishing a
6	comprehensive program of prevention, including the coordination
7	<u>of self-help groups.</u>
8	(2) An evaluation of the effectiveness of the program in
9	reducing the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs, including
10	prescription opioids, by students.
11	(3) A plan to actively involve staff, students, parents and
12	other community members in the development and implementation of
13	the program.
