AN ACT

Amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue 2 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing 3 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and 4 Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 5 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 6 further providing for civil penalties and license 7 suspension," further providing for civil penalties. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 5(b) of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, 11 12 No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his 13 designee to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board 14 activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of 15 Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational 16 Affairs; and further providing for civil penalties and license 17 suspension," is amended to read: 18 19 Section 5. Civil penalties. 2.0

(b) Additional powers. -- In addition to the disciplinary

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- 1 powers and duties of the boards and commissions within the
- 2 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs under their
- 3 respective practice acts, boards and commissions shall have the
- 4 power, respectively:
- 5 (1) To impose discipline, including, but not limited to,
- a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation on any
- 7 licensee, registrant, certificate holder, permit holder or
- 8 unlicensed person who violates a lawful disciplinary order of
- 9 the board.
- 10 (2) To impose discipline, including, but not limited to,
- a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation on any
- 12 licensee, registrant, certificate holder, permit holder or
- unlicensed person who aids and abets the unlicensed practice
- of a profession, occupation or business.
- 15 (3) To levy a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000 per
- violation on any corporation, partnership, institution,
- 17 association or sole proprietorship which aids and abets any
- individual in the unlicensed practice of a profession. This
- 19 penalty shall not, however, be levied against any person
- solely as a consequence of that person being a patient or
- 21 client of the unlicensed individual.
- 22 (4) To levy a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000 per
- violation on any licensee, registrant, certificate holder,
- 24 permit holder or unlicensed person who violates any provision
- of the applicable licensing act or board regulation.
- 26 (5) To assess against the respondent determined to be in
- 27 violation of the disciplinary provisions administered by a
- licensing board or commission in a disciplinary proceeding
- 29 pending before the board or commission for final
- determination, as part of the sanction, the costs of

- 1 investigation underlying that disciplinary action. The cost
- of investigation shall not include those costs incurred by
- 3 the board or commission after the filing of formal actions or
- 4 disciplinary charges against the respondent.
- 5 (6) To collect all fees, costs, fines and penalties 6 assessed as a result of a disciplinary proceeding before a
- 7 licensing board or commission.
- 8 (7) To deny, suspend or revoke a license, registration,
- 9 certification or permit for failure to pay any penalty, fee,
- 10 interest or cost assessed as a result of a disciplinary
- 11 proceeding before a licensing board or commission.
- 12 (8) To provide for the carryover of any continuing
- education credits in excess of the number required for
- 14 <u>biennial renewal. The carryover shall be valid for one</u>
- biennial renewal term only. As used in this paragraph, the
- 16 <u>term "continuing education" includes any term similar in</u>
- 17 nature used by the boards and commissions within the Bureau
- of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
