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AN ACT

1 Designating a portion of State Route 1001 in Greene Township,  
2 Franklin County, as the Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman,  
3 Jr., Memorial Highway.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., Memorial  
7 Highway.

8 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
9 follows:

10 (1) Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., of  
11 Fayetteville, died while supporting combat operations in  
12 Helmand Province, Afghanistan, on February 1, 2010, paying  
13 the supreme sacrifice for his nation in Operation Enduring  
14 Freedom.

15 (2) A 2008 graduate of Chambersburg Area High School,  
16 Lance Corporal Freeman had served in the Marine Corps since

1 August 2008.

2 (3) Lance Corporal Freeman, a machine gunner assigned to  
3 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary  
4 Force in Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, had been on his first  
5 deployment in Afghanistan since October 2009.

6 (4) Lance Corporal Freeman was awarded the Purple Heart,  
7 Combat Action Ribbon and the Afghanistan Campaign Medal.

8 (b) Designation.--The section of State Route 1001 from  
9 Memorial Road to Mt. Pleasant Road in Greene Township, Franklin  
10 County, is designated the Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman,  
11 Jr., Memorial Highway.

12 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
13 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to  
14 traffic in both directions on the highway.

15 Section 2. Effective date.

16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
