## AN ACT

- Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
  Consolidated Statutes, providing for the Combat-to-College
  Program.

- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 12 <u>8802</u>. <u>Definitions</u>.
- 13 8803. Student veterans program.

- 17 8807. Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.

- 3 § 8801. Scope of chapter.
- 4 This chapter relates to the Combat-to-College Program.
- 5 § 8802. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 "Active military service." Active service in any of the
- 10 armed services or forces of the United States or of this
- 11 Commonwealth.
- 12 "Community college." An institution established and operated
- 13 under Article XIX-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 14 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 15 "Department." The Department of Military and Veterans
- 16 Affairs of the Commonwealth.
- 17 <u>"Private education institution." An institution within this</u>
- 18 Commonwealth that is legally authorized to grant degrees or
- 19 career and technical certifications and that is not statutorily
- 20 established as an instrumentality of this Commonwealth nor a
- 21 State-related institution or community college.
- 22 <u>"State higher education institution." A State system</u>
- 23 institution, a State-related institution or a community college
- 24 located within this Commonwealth.
- 25 "State-related institution." A nonprofit institution that
- 26 meets all of the following:
- 27 (1) Is legally authorized to grant degrees.
- 28 (2) Offers needed, specified higher education services
- in the public interest of this Commonwealth.
- 30 (3) Is statutorily established as an instrumentality of

- 1 this Commonwealth.
- 2 (4) Receives a direct annual Commonwealth appropriation.
- 3 "State system institution." A member university as provided
- 4 for in section 2002-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 5 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 6 <u>"Student veteran." An individual who is attending or</u>
- 7 planning to attend a State higher education institution or
- 8 private education institution and is serving in the United
- 9 States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or National
- 10 Guard, or has served in the United States Armed Forces,
- 11 including a reserve component or National Guard, and who was
- 12 <u>discharged or released from service under conditions other than</u>
- 13 dishonorable.
- 14 "Task force." The Statewide Combat-to-College Task Force
- 15 established under section 8805 (relating to Statewide Combat-to-
- 16 <u>College Task Force</u>).
- 17 § 8803. Student veterans program.
- 18 Each campus of a State higher education institution shall
- 19 provide the services and a coordinator described under section
- 20 8804 (relating to requirements) to help student veterans go from
- 21 combat to college in order to create a positive educational
- 22 environment for student veterans to successfully graduate from
- 23 universities and vocational degree programs while recognizing
- 24 the skills, training and experience associated with military
- 25 training.
- 26 § 8804. Requirements.
- 27 <u>(a) Requirements.--Each State higher education institution</u>
- 28 shall do the following:
- 29 <u>(1) For a campus that is not solely online, provide a</u>
- 30 centralized geographic location on campus for student

veterans for admissions, class registration, financial aid
administration and the coordinator under subsection (b) to
the extent that funds are available.
(2) Provide outreach, information and advocacy
assistance to student veterans to help ensure that they
receive reasonable accommodations for a disability under
Federal and State laws.
(3) Develop programs to provide academic and career
counseling specifically for student veterans that may
include, but not be limited to, peer mentoring and peer
support programs.
(4) Develop programs to provide reasonable access to
specialized mental health counseling services or resources
for student veterans.
(5) Develop job search assistance programs designed fo
a student veteran during a student veteran's enrollment and
for at least two years following the student veteran's
graduation.
(6) Not charge an admissions fee or similar fee for a
student veteran returning to the same education institution
that the student veteran attended prior to mobilization.
(7) Provide specific information on programs developed
or coordinated under this chapter, and other information
relevant to student veterans, on the institution's publicly
accessible Internet website.
(8) Provide postsecondary credit to student veterans for
military training while providing active military service i
the American Council on Education recommends that

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postsecondary credit should be provided for military training

or provide preadmission counseling to provide a prospective

- 1 student veteran a detailed analysis of what postsecondary
- 2 <u>credit will be accepted based on the student veteran's</u>
- 3 military training.
- 4 <u>(9) Provide a student veteran an alternative status that</u>
- 5 <u>reflects mobilization rather than a "W" or withdrawn status</u>
- on a student veteran's transcript at the student veteran's
- 7 <u>request if the student veteran is being called to active</u>
- 8 <u>Federal or State duty.</u>
- 9 (10) Provide for community-based collaborations to allow
- the private sector to support combat-to-college programs
- 11 <u>through financial and in-kind gifts.</u>
- 12 (b) Coordinator duties. -- Each State higher education
- 13 <u>institution shall designate a coordinator for each campus who</u>
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) Develop programs to promote a positive educational
- 16 <u>environment for student veterans.</u>
- 17 (2) Implement training programs for the staff relating
- 18 to identifying and assisting student veterans who may benefit
- from the specialized services and resources developed or
- 20 coordinated under this chapter.
- 21 (3) Make recommendations to the State higher education
- 22 institution's administration and the task force concerning
- 23 ways to improve the education of student veterans.
- 24 <u>(4) Coordinate access to stress management, counseling</u>
- 25 <u>programs and other resources available.</u>
- 26 (5) Coordinate with the department to educate student
- 27 <u>veterans about available Commonwealth programs.</u>
- 28 (6) Coordinate with the United States Department of
- 29 Veterans Affairs to educate student veterans on available
- 30 Federal benefits, including work-study programs offered by

1	the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
2	(7) Coordinate activities, seminars and programs for
3	student veterans presented by veterans organizations.
4	(8) Coordinate campus activities and social events
5	designed for student veterans.
6	(9) Coordinate programs to assist student veterans in
7	locating employment and internships.
8	§ 8805. Statewide Combat-to-College Task Force.
9	(a) Establishment and composition A Statewide Combat-to-
10	College Task Force shall be established, consisting of the
11	<pre>following members:</pre>
12	(1) Four members appointed by the Governor, one of whom
13	shall be from each of the following:
14	(i) a State system institution;
15	(ii) a State-related institution;
16	(iii) a community college; and
17	(iv) a private education institution that provides
18	services specified under section 8804 (relating to
19	requirements) to student veterans.
20	(2) One member appointed by the Governor who serves on
21	the State Veterans' Commission.
22	(3) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Higher Education
23	Assistance Agency or a designee.
24	(4) The Secretary of Education or a designee.
25	(5) The Adjutant General or a designee.
26	(6) Three members appointed by the Governor who are
27	student veterans or former student veteran representatives.
28	(7) One Senator appointed by the President pro tempore
29	of the Senate, one Senator appointed by the Minority Leader
30	of the Senate, one member of the House of Representatives

- appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
- 2 one member of the House of Representatives appointed by the
- 3 <u>Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.</u>
- 4 (b) Terms. -- Terms of members under subsection (a) shall be
- 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The members under subsection (a) (1), (2), (3), (4),
- 7 (5) and (6) shall serve four-year terms.
- 8 (2) The members under subsection (a) (7) shall serve two-
- 9 <u>year terms.</u>
- 10 (c) Vacancies. -- Any vacancy on the task force shall be
- 11 <u>filled by the original appointing officer.</u>
- 12 (d) Duties.--
- 13 (1) Assess, refine and recommend improvements for
- 14 <u>outreach services to provide veterans with necessary</u>
- information regarding postsecondary opportunities upon return
- from service and develop best practices to help the veterans
- 17 graduate from this Commonwealth's postsecondary education
- 18 institutions.
- 19 (2) Review and approve annual applications of State
- higher education institutions that demonstrate compliance
- 21 <u>with section 8804 in order to receive the "Combat-to-College</u>
- 22 <u>Certified" title.</u>
- 23 (3) Review and approve annual applications from private
- 24 education institutions to receive a "Combat-to-College"
- 25 <u>Certified" title for voluntary compliance with this chapter.</u>
- 26 (4) Promote partnerships with the United States
- 27 <u>Department of Veterans' Affairs that help reduce out-of-</u>
- 28 pocket expenses to student veterans.
- 29 <u>(5) Assess gaps in student support and policy that may</u>
- 30 exist at the Federal level, including the Servicemen's

- 1 Readjustment Act of 1944 (58 Stat. 284) and the Federal Pell
- 2 Grant Program, and recommend changes in the Federal Student
- 3 Aid programs and the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 4 Agency's programs to develop solutions to result in
- 5 <u>unfettered access to postsecondary education opportunities.</u>
- 6 (6) Provide ways to easily report accurate data on the
- 7 <u>use and results of the programs authorized under this</u>
- 8 <u>chapter.</u>
- 9 (7) Promote partnerships to provide financial resources
- 10 to help enable State higher education institutions and
- 11 <u>private education institutions to meet the State standards</u>
- 12 <u>authorized under this chapter.</u>
- 13 (8) Receive comments and testimony from student veterans
- and others.
- 15 (9) Annually report to the General Assembly on the use
- and results of the programs described under this chapter.
- 17 § 8806. Private education institutions.
- 18 A private education institution shall be awarded an annual
- 19 "Combat-to-College Certified" status by the task force if the
- 20 private education institution voluntarily complies with State
- 21 standards for student veterans' programs as described in section
- 22 8804 (relating to requirements).
- 23 § 8807. Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.
- 24 (a) Department assistance. -- The department may assist the
- 25 task force in the task force's duties.
- 26 (b) Funding.--The department may apply for Federal and
- 27 private funding for training, outreach and other expenses to
- 28 <u>help enable State higher education institutions and private</u>
- 29 education institutions meet the State standards authorized under
- 30 this chapter.

- 1 (c) Reports. -- The department shall publish on the
- 2 <u>department's publicly accessible Internet website the reports on</u>
- 3 information collected under sections 8804 (relating to
- 4 requirements), 8805 (relating to Statewide Combat-to-College
- 5 Task Force), 8806 (relating to private education institutions)
- 6 and 8808 (relating to reporting provisions) with other
- 7 <u>information the department deems useful to assist student</u>
- 8 <u>veterans.</u>
- 9 § 8808. Reporting provisions.
- 10 Starting 90 days after the effective date of this section,
- 11 <u>each State higher education institution and private education</u>
- 12 <u>institution voluntarily deemed as "Combat-to-College Certified"</u>
- 13 shall annually report to the department and to the task force
- 14 that the State higher education institution or private education
- 15 institution offers the services described under section 8804
- 16 <u>(relating to requirements)</u> and the utilization and results of
- 17 the services authorized under this chapter.
- 18 § 8809. Sunset provision.
- 19 This chapter shall expire 15 years from the effective date of
- 20 this section.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 22 (1) Sections 8803 and 8804 of Title 51 shall take effect
- in one year.
- 24 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- days.
