AN ACT

1 Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled, as
2 reenacted and amended, "An act concerning townships of the
3 second class; and amending, revising, consolidating and
4 changing the law relating thereto," in township supervisors,
5 further providing for compensation of supervisors.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Section 606(a) of the act of May 1, 1933
9 (P.L.103, No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, is
10 amended to read:

11 Section 606. Compensation of Supervisors.--(a) Supervisors
12 may receive as compensation an amount established by ordinance
13 not in excess of the following:

Township	Annual Maximum
Population	Compensation
not more than 4,999	[\$1,875] <u>\$2,850</u>
5,000 to 9,999	[\$2,500] <u>\$3,800</u>
10,000 to 14,999	[\$3,250] <u>\$4,750</u>
15,000 to 24,999	[\$4,125] <u>\$5,700</u>

1 25,000 to 34,999 [\$4,375] \$6,675

2 35,000 or more [\$5,000] \$7,625

3 Salaries are payable monthly or quarterly for the duties imposed
4 by this act. The population is determined by the latest official
5 census figures, except that no township shall be required to
6 reduce the salary of a supervisor as a result of a decrease in
7 population. The compensation of supervisors, when employed as
8 roadmasters, laborers, secretary, treasurer, assistant
9 secretary, assistant treasurer or in any employe capacity not
10 otherwise prohibited by this or any other act, shall be
11 determined by the board of auditors, at an hourly, daily,
12 weekly, semi-monthly or monthly basis, which shall be comparable
13 to compensation paid in the locality for similar services. The
14 board of supervisors may establish a mileage allowance, under
15 the act of July 20, 1979 (P.L.156, No.51), referred to as the
16 Uniform Mileage Fee Law, to be paid to officers and employes for
17 the use of a personal vehicle when required and actually used
18 for authorized township business. No supervisor may receive
19 compensation as an employe for attending a meeting of the board
20 of supervisors. Supervisors may continue to be compensated under
21 prior law until such time as an ordinance is enacted under this
22 act. Any change in salary, compensation or emoluments of the
23 elected office becomes effective at the beginning of the next
24 term of the supervisor. A decision by the township to pay, in
25 whole or in part, to include supervisors not employed by the
26 township in insurance plans, as authorized in subsection (c),
27 shall not be implemented with regard to any nonemploye
28 supervisor until the beginning of the next term of that
29 supervisor.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
