1 2 3	Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in boards and offices, providing for Commonwealth Office of Management and Budget.

5	hereby enacts as follows:

- 6 The General Assembly finds and declares that the Commonwealth
- 7 will benefit from devoting adequate resources to do the
- 8 <u>following:</u>
- 9 <u>(1) Gather and coordinate data in a timely manner.</u>
- 10 (2) Perform comprehensive and detailed budgeting
- 11 <u>analyses.</u>
- 12 (3) Implement comprehensive and effective budgeting
- 13 <u>practices.</u>
- 14 (4) Coordinate all functions related to budgeting and
- controlling spending in State government.
- 16 (5) Coordinate all functions related to information
- technology in State government.
- 18 (6) Coordinate all functions of human resources in State
- 19 government.
- 20 (7) Coordinate all functions of procurement in State
- 21 government.
- 22 (8) Perform comprehensive and detailed financial

- 3 § 4303. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 <u>"Administrative Code of 1929." The act of April 9, 1929</u>
- 8 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 9 "Continuous improvement process system." A management
- 10 methodology system that combines tools to improve process speed
- 11 and reduce waste with data-driven project analysis to provide
- 12 products and services with improved quality at a lower cost. The
- 13 term may involve any of the following strategies:
- 14 (1) Developing a process map that describes the lean
- government principles or another widely accepted business
- process improvement system by which an executive agency
- 17 engages in specific activities that have the purpose of
- increasing efficiency and eliminating waste in the processes
- 19 <u>used to deliver goods and services to taxpayers and customers</u>
- of this Commonwealth. This strategy includes the measurement
- 21 of the outcomes regarding increased efficiency and the
- 22 elimination of waste and procedures by which the executive
- agency produces goods or serves its customers.
- 24 (2) Engaging in specific activities to rapidly improve
- 25 <u>an executive agency's processes that will increase value or</u>
- decrease staff time, inventory, defects, overproduction,
- 27 <u>complexity, delays or excessive movement.</u>
- 28 (3) Involving executive agency employees at all levels
- 29 to map the executive agency's processes and recommend
- improvements, with specific importance placed on the

- 1 involvement of executive agency employees closest to the
- 2 customer or end user of the State government product or
- 3 service.
- 4 (4) Providing the means to measure each process in order
- 5 <u>to demonstrate the effectiveness of each process or process</u>
- 6 <u>improvement.</u>
- 7 (5) Training executive agency employees to mentor and
- 8 <u>train other executive agency employees in continuous</u>
- 9 <u>improvement process systems.</u>
- 10 "Director." The director of the office.
- 11 "Executive agency." Any of the following:
- 12 <u>(1) The Governor's Office.</u>
- 13 (2) A department, board, commission, authority or other
- 14 agency of the Commonwealth that is subject to the policy
- 15 <u>supervision and control of the Governor.</u>
- 16 (3) The Office of Lieutenant Governor.
- 17 (4) An independent department.
- 18 (5) An independent agency.
- 19 "Executive board." As specified in section 204 of the
- 20 Administrative Code of 1929.
- "Independent agency." A board, commission, authority or
- 22 other agency of the Commonwealth that is not subject to the
- 23 policy supervision and control of the Governor. The term does
- 24 not include:
- 25 (1) A court or agency of the unified judicial system.
- 26 (2) The General Assembly or an agency of the General
- 27 <u>Assembly.</u>
- 28 "Independent department." Any of the following:
- 29 (1) The Department of the Auditor General.
- 30 <u>(2) The Treasury Department.</u>

- 2 (4) A board or commission of an entity under paragraph
- 3 (1), (2) or (3).
- 4 <u>"Office." The Commonwealth Office of Management and Budget</u>

- The Commonwealth Office of Management and Budget is
- 21 established as an administrative department within the executive
- 22 branch of the government of this Commonwealth.
- 23 § 4312. Organization of office.
- 24 (a) Division of responsibilities. -- The office shall be
- 25 divided into the following:
- 26 (1) The Bureau of Budget and Financial Management.
- 27 (2) The Bureau of Procurement.

- 13 <u>(1) The Office of the Budget.</u>
- 14 (2) The Department of General Services.
- 15 (3) The Office of Administration.
- 16 (4) The Office of Policy and Planning.
- 17 (b) Transfer of powers and duties.--
- 18 <u>(1) The powers and duties vested in the Secretary of the</u>
- 19 Budget, the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of
- 20 Administration and the Secretary of Policy and Planning are
- 21 transferred to the director, who shall exercise the powers
- and perform the duties that those secretaries exercised or
- 23 performed prior to the effective date of this section. Any
- reference to the Secretary of the Budget, the Secretary of
- 25 General Services, the Secretary of Administration or the
- 26 Secretary of Policy and Planning shall be a reference to the
- 27 <u>director on or after the effective date of this section.</u>
- 28 (2) The following are transferred to the office:
- 29 (i) All bureaus, organizations and divisions in the
- 30 Office of the Budget, the Department of General Services,

the Office of Administration or the Office of Policy and
Planning responsible for the functions specified in this
chapter.

(ii) All personnel, allocations, appropriations,
equipment, files, records, contracts, agreements,
obligations and other materials which are used, employed
or expended by the Office of the Budget, the Department
of General Services, the Office of Administration or the
Office of Policy and Planning in connection with the
functions transferred by this chapter to the office in
the first instance and as if these contracts, agreements
and obligations had been incurred or entered into by the
office.

- 14 (c) Apportionment. -- The personnel, appropriations, equipment
- 15 and other items and material transferred by this section shall
- 16 <u>include an appropriate portion of the general administrative</u>,
- 17 overhead and supporting personnel, appropriations, equipment and
- 18 other material of the Office of the Budget, the Department of
- 19 General Services, the Office of Administration or the Office of
- 20 Policy and Planning and shall also include, where applicable,
- 21 Federal grants and funds and other benefits from any Federal
- 22 program.

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- 23 (d) Status of employees.--All personnel transferred under
- 24 this chapter shall retain any civil service employment status
- 25 assigned to the personnel.
- 26 § 4314. Redesignation.
- 27 <u>(a) Office of the Budget.--</u>
- 28 (1) The Office of the Budget shall be known as the
- 29 Bureau of Budget and Financial Management.
- 30 (2) A reference to the Office of the Budget in a statute

1	or regulation shall be deemed a reference to the office.
2	(3) To provide an efficient and cost-minimizing
3	transition, licenses, contracts, deeds and other official
4	actions of the Office of the Budget shall not be affected by
5	the use of the designation as Bureau of Budget and Financial
6	Management. The Office of the Budget may continue to use the
7	name "Office of the Budget" on badges, licenses, contracts,
8	deeds, stationery and other official documents until existing
9	supplies are exhausted. The Office of the Budget may
10	substitute the title "Office of Management and Budget" for
11	"Office of the Budget" on its documents and materials on a

13	(4) The Office of the Budget shall not replace existing
14	signage at its locations with the redesignated name until the
15	signs are worn and in need of replacement. This transition
16	shall be coordinated with changes in administration.
17	(5) The Office of the Budget shall continue to use the
18	name "Office of the Budget" on its computer systems until the
19	time of routine upgrades in each computer system in the
20	Office of the Budget. The change in name shall be made at the
21	time of the routine upgrade to the computer systems.
22	(b) Department of General Services
23	(1) The Department of General Services shall be known as
24	the Bureau of Procurement and the Bureau of State Facilities
25	and Maintenance under the office. The following shall apply:
26	(i) The powers and duties of the Department of
27	General Services shall be divided between the Bureau of
28	Procurement and the Bureau of State Facilities and
29	Maintenance.
30	(ii) The strategic plan under section 4318 (relating

1	to strategic plan) shall provide a clear division of the
2	powers and duties transferred from the Department of
3	General Services to the office and the Bureau of
4	Procurement and the Bureau of State Facilities and
5	Maintenance.
6	(2) A reference to the Department of General Services in
7	a statute or regulation shall be deemed a reference to the
8	office.
9	(3) To provide an efficient and cost-minimizing
10	transition, licenses, contracts, deeds and other official
11	actions of the Department of General Services shall not be
12	affected by the use of the designation as Bureau of
13	Procurement or Bureau of State Facilities and Maintenance.
14	The department may continue to use the name "Department of
15	General Services" on badges, licenses, contracts, deeds,
16	stationery and other official documents until existing
17	supplies are exhausted. The department may substitute the
18	title "Office of Management and Budget" for "Department of
19	General Services" on its documents and materials on a
20	schedule that is deemed appropriate.
21	(4) The Department of General Services shall not replace
22	existing signage at its locations with the redesignated name
23	until the signs are worn and in need of replacement. This
24	transition shall be coordinated with changes in
25	administration.
26	(5) The Department of General Services shall continue to
27	use the name "Department of General Services" on its computer
28	systems until the time of routine upgrades in each computer
29	system in the department. The change in name shall be made at
3.0	the time of the routine upgrade to the computer systems.

1	(c) Office of Administration
2	(1) The Office of Administration shall be known as the
3	Bureau of Human Resources and the Bureau of Information
4	Technology under the office. The following shall apply:
5	(i) The powers and duties of the Office of
6	Administration shall be divided between the Bureau of
7	Human Resources and the Bureau of Information Technology.
8	(ii) The strategic plan under section 4318 shall
9	provide a clear division of the powers and duties
10	transferred from the Office of Administration to the
11	office and the Bureau of Human Resources and the Bureau
12	of Information Technology.
13	(2) A reference to the Office of Administration in a
14	statute or regulation shall be deemed a reference to the
15	office.
16	(3) To provide an efficient and cost-minimizing
17	transition, licenses, contracts, deeds and other official
18	actions of the Office of Administration shall not be affected
19	by the use of the designation as Bureau of Human Resources or
20	Bureau of Information Technology. The Office of
21	Administration may continue to use the name "Office of
22	Administration" on badges, licenses, contracts, deeds,
23	stationery and other official documents until existing
24	supplies are exhausted. The Office of Administration may
25	substitute the title "Office of Management and Budget" for
26	"Office of Administration" on its documents and materials on
27	a schedule that is deemed appropriate.
28	(4) The Office of Administration shall not replace
29	existing signage at its locations with the redesignated name
30	until the signs are worn and in need of replacement. This

1	transition shall be coordinated with changes in
2	administration.
3	(5) The Office of Administration shall continue to use
4	the name "Office of Administration" on its computer systems
5	until the time of routine upgrades in each computer system in
6	the Office of Administration. The change in name shall be
7	made at the time of the routine upgrade to the computer
8	systems.
9	(d) Office of Policy and Planning
10	(1) The Office of Policy and Planning shall be known as
11	the Bureau of Policy and Planning.
12	(2) A reference to the Office of Policy and Planning in
13	a statute or regulation shall be deemed a reference to the
14	Bureau of Policy and Planning.
15	(3) To provide an efficient and cost-minimizing
16	transition, licenses, contracts, deeds and other official
17	actions of the Office of Policy and Planning shall not be
18	affected by the use of the designation as Bureau of Policy
19	and Planning. The Office of Policy and Planning may continue
20	to use the name "Office of Policy and Planning" on badges,
21	licenses, contracts, deeds, stationery and other official
22	documents until existing supplies are exhausted. The Office
23	of Policy and Planning may substitute the title "Office of
24	Management and Budget" for "Office of Policy and Planning" on
25	its documents and materials on a schedule that is deemed
26	appropriate.

27 (4) The Office of Policy and Planning shall not replace 28 existing signage at its locations with the redesignated name 29 until the signs are worn and in need of replacement. This 30 transition shall be coordinated with changes in

- 1 administration.
- 2 (5) The Office of Policy and Planning shall continue to
- 3 use the name "Office of Policy and Planning" on its computer
- 4 <u>systems until the time of routine upgrades in each computer</u>
- 5 system in the Office of Policy and Planning. The change in
- 6 name shall be made at the time of the routine upgrade to the
- 7 <u>computer systems.</u>
- 8 § 4315. Civil service status.
- 9 All positions in the office shall be deemed to be included in
- 10 the list of positions under section 3(d) of the act of August 5,
- 11 1941 (P.L.752, No.286), known as the Civil Service Act, and the
- 12 provisions and benefits of that act shall apply to the employees
- 13 of and positions in the office.
- 14 <u>§ 4316. Director.</u>
- 15 (a) Nomination. -- No later than 30 days after the submittal
- 16 of the strategic plan under section 4318 (relating to strategic
- 17 plan), the Governor shall nominate an individual to serve as
- 18 <u>director</u>.
- 19 (b) Term.--The director shall serve at the pleasure of the
- 20 Governor.
- 21 (c) Appointments. -- The director shall appoint the executive
- 22 director of each of the bureaus within the office. Each
- 23 executive director shall possess appropriate qualifications to
- 24 serve in that capacity.
- 25 (d) Salary.--The annual salary of the director shall be
- 26 \$166,000 or at a higher level as established by the Governor
- 27 with the approval of the executive board.
- 28 (e) Policy planning. -- To perform the duties transferred to
- 29 the director under this chapter, the director shall direct and
- 30 oversee policy planning for the Governor to ensure that:

Τ	(1) the State government is managed in an efficient
2	<pre>manner;</pre>
3	(2) the Governor's policies and programs are efficiently
4	implemented and administered; and
5	(3) the Governor's policies and programs are directly
6	tied to the management of the Commonwealth's finances in a

8	(i) improves government services to taxpayers; and
9	(ii) strengthens and grows the economy and improves
10	the long-term fiscal health of the Commonwealth.
11	§ 4317. Governor's Office of Transformation, Innovation,
12	Management and Efficiency.
13	(a) EstablishmentThe Governor's Office of Transformation,
14	Innovation, Management and Efficiency is established within the
15	office.
16	(b) Executive director The Governor's Office shall be
17	headed by an executive director who shall be appointed by the
18	director and who shall report to the director.
19	(c) Support services The office shall provide all support
20	services and staff for the Governor's Office.
21	(d) Powers and duties The Governor's Office shall:
22	(1) Deliver cost savings to the residents of this
23	Commonwealth through multiagency efficiencies, productivity
24	improvements and cost-saving innovations.
25	(2) Remain fully and continuously engaged with executive
26	agencies to identify new project needs and opportunities.
27	(3) Promote and foster a culture of innovation, open
28	data and collaboration across executive agencies in alignment
29	with the priorities of the Governor.
30	(4) Identify partnering opportunities with nonprofit

1	organizations and local communities to leverage resources
2	that will save taxpayer dollars.
3	(5) Focus on citizen engagement to further improve user-
4	oriented services and realize cost efficiencies through the
5	use of modern platforms.
6	(6) Increase the involvement and participation of State
7	employees at all levels in improving management, reducing
8	waste and improving the delivery of State services.
9	(7) Work collaboratively with the heads of executive
10	agencies to identify opportunities for streamlining the
11	operation of government and generating new efficiencies.
12	(8) Develop and implement strategies for implementing
13	the opportunities specified in paragraph (7).
14	(9) Identify barriers to the implementation of
15	transformational efforts and recommend strategies for
16	addressing these barriers.
17	(10) Provide training to State employees in continuous
18	<pre>improvement.</pre>
19	(e) Cooperation by executive agencies
20	(1) All executive agencies shall cooperate with the
21	<pre>Governor's Office.</pre>
22	(2) Executive agency heads shall identify key staff to
23	form innovation teams, which shall be responsible for
24	implementing the initiatives identified by the bureau.
25	Innovation teams shall recommend to the bureau new
26	opportunities to reduce costs and improve efficiency.
27	(f) Definitions As used in this section, the following
28	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
29	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
30	"Governor's Office." The Governor's Office of

- 1 Transformation, Innovation, Management and Efficiency
- 2 <u>established under this section.</u>
- 3 § 4318. Strategic plan.
- 4 (a) Development. -- Within 60 days of the effective date of
- 5 this section, the Governor shall:
- 6 (1) subject to subsection (b), contract with a qualified
- 7 <u>third party to develop a strategic plan under this section;</u>
- 8 <u>or</u>
- 9 (2) execute a memorandum of understanding with the
- 10 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to develop a
- 11 <u>strategic plan under this section.</u>
- 12 (b) Third-party contract. -- The Governor may enter into a
- 13 contract with a qualified third-party organization under this
- 14 section if the organization:
- 15 (1) has experience with large corporate mergers of a
- 16 company which has more than 500 employees;
- 17 (2) has experience assisting in the merging of
- 18 government agencies in other states; and
- 19 (3) utilizes continuous improvement process systems to
- strengthen the efficiency and delivery of service of agencies
- or corporations undergoing a merger.
- 22 (c) Parameters. -- The strategic plan under this section shall
- 23 detail the merger of the Office of the Budget, the Department of
- 24 General Services, the Office of Administration and the Office of
- 25 Policy and Planning, in accordance with the provisions of this
- 26 chapter, and shall provide for:
- 27 (1) A 20% reduction in administrative costs.
- 28 (2) The consolidation of similar programs.
- 29 (3) The elimination of redundancy to maximize taxpayer
- 30 dollars.

- 1 (4) The improvement of agency services to residents of
- 2 this Commonwealth at a lower cost to taxpayers.
- 3 (5) A continuous improvement process system throughout
- 4 <u>executive agencies.</u>
- 5 (6) Financial transparency to residents of this
- 6 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 7 (7) A uniform accounting system and prudent financial
- 8 <u>management throughout executive agencies.</u>
- 9 (d) Submittal.--No later than 210 days after the effective
- 10 dates of this section, the strategic plan under this section
- 11 shall be submitted to the General Assembly for review and any
- 12 <u>hearings deemed necessary.</u>
- 13 Section 2. All other acts or parts of acts are repealed
- 14 insofar as they are inconsistent with this act.
- 15 Section 3. Except as otherwise provided in 71 Pa.C.S. Ch.
- 16 43, all activities regarding the powers and duties under 71
- 17 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 which were initiated under the Office of the
- 18 Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of
- 19 Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning shall
- 20 continue and remain in full force and effect and may be
- 21 completed under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43. Orders, regulations, rules
- 22 and decisions which were made under the authority of the Office
- 23 of the Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of
- 24 Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning regarding
- 25 the powers and duties under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 and which are in
- 26 effect on the effective date of 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 shall remain
- 27 in full force and effect until revoked, vacated or modified
- 28 under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43. Contracts, obligations and collective
- 29 bargaining agreements entered into under the authority of the
- 30 Office of the Budget, the Department of General Services, the

- 1 Office of Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning
- 2 are not affected nor impaired by the transfer of powers and
- 3 duties under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43.
- 4 Section 4. Any expenditures needed to implement this act
- 5 shall be paid using encumbered funds of the respective executive
- 6 agency.
- 7 Section 5. Within 10 days of the nomination under 71 Pa.C.S.
- 8 § 4316(a), the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall provide
- 9 notice of the nomination to the Legislative Reference Bureau,
- 10 which shall publish the notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 11 Section 6. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 12 (1) The following shall take effect immediately:
- 13 (i) This section and section 5 of this act.
- 14 (ii) The addition of 71 Pa.C.S. §§ 4301, 4302, 4303,
- 15 4316 and 4318.
- 16 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect 30 days
- 17 after publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the notice
- 18 under section 5 of this act.
