## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 5 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for certain institutions and organizations and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight 18 Fund, the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development Restricted 19 Receipts Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund, the 20 21 Multimodal Transportation Fund, the State Racing Fund and the ABLE Savings Program Fund to the Executive Department; to 22 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System 23 24 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 25 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal 26 year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for the proper operation 27 of several departments of the Commonwealth and the 28 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License 29 Fund money; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal 30 funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the 31 32 Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 33
