AN ACT

- Amending the act of October 10, 1975 (P.L.383, No.110), entitled "An act relating to the practice of physical therapy," 1

- further providing for qualifications for license and 3
- examinations for physical therapists and physical therapist
- 5 assistants.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Sections 6(b) and 9.1(a) of the act of October 8
- 10, 1975 (P.L.383, No.110), known as the Physical Therapy
- Practice Act, are amended to read: 10
- 11 Section 6. Oualifications for License; Examinations; Failure
- 12 of Examinations; Licensure Without Examination; Issuing of
- 13 License; Foreign Applicants for Licensure; Temporary License;
- Perjury. -- * * * 14
- 15 An applicant for licensure must pass an examination
- 16 approved by the board which shall test the applicant's knowledge
- 17 of the basic and clinical sciences as they relate to physical
- 18 therapy theory and physical therapy procedures and such other
- 19 subjects as the board may deem necessary to test the applicant's

- 1 fitness to practice physical therapy. No license shall be
- 2 granted unless an applicant has attained passing scores
- 3 established by the testing agency and published prior to the
- 4 administration of the examination. The examination shall be held
- 5 at such time and place as the board shall determine. An
- 6 applicant who is 90 days from completing the professional study
- 7 of physical therapy may sit for the examination if the applicant
- 8 verifies with the board that the applicant is 90 days from
- 9 graduating from an accredited program as determined by the
- 10 board.

- 12 Section 9.1. Physical Therapist Assistant; Education and
- 13 Examination; Scope of Duties; Certification. -- (a) To be
- 14 eligible for certification by the board as a physical therapist
- 15 assistant, an applicant must be at least 18 years of age unless
- 16 otherwise determined by the board, be of good moral character,
- 17 not be addicted to the habitual use of alcohol or narcotics or
- 18 other habit-forming drugs, be a graduate of a physical therapist
- 19 assistant program adopted by the board, which program has been
- 20 approved for the education and training for physical therapist
- 21 assistants by the appropriate nationally recognized accrediting
- 22 agency and be successful in passing an examination approved by
- 23 the board, subject to rules and regulations established by the
- 24 board and administered in accordance with section 812.1 of the
- 25 act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The
- 26 Administrative Code of 1929." Applicants eligible to register
- 27 with the board shall be deemed eliqible for certification by the
- 28 board until such time as the board promulgates any regulation
- 29 regarding certification. No applicant shall be certified unless
- 30 he has attained passing scores established by the board and

- 1 published prior to the administration of the examination. An
- 2 applicant who is 90 days from completing the education required
- 3 for a physical therapist assistant may sit for the examination
- 4 <u>if the applicant verifies with the board that the applicant is</u>
- 5 90 days from graduating from an accredited program as determined
- 6 by the board.

- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
