## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing December 7, 2017, as "Great Law Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, William Penn prepared and supervised the creation of
- 4 a series of statutes for Pennsylvania which became known as the
- 5 "Great Law"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Soon after his arrival in Pennsylvania in October
- 7 1682, William Penn called for a legislature to meet; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's first legislature met in what is now
- 9 Chester from December 4 through 7, 1682; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The legislature concluded reviewing and passing the
- 11 series of statutes which became known as the "Great Law" on
- 12 December 7, 1682; and
- 13 WHEREAS, This action effectively set in motion the enduring
- 14 principle of representative government for the residents of
- 15 Pennsylvania, which has flourished under Pennsylvania's

- 1 subsequent frames, charters and constitutions; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The "Great Law" enshrined many vital freedoms for
- 3 Pennsylvanians, particularly religious liberty and freedom of
- 4 worship; and
- 5 WHEREAS, These statutes also established the foundation of a
- 6 stable government in Pennsylvania by providing for the
- 7 maintenance of records, establishment of courts, conduct of
- 8 trials, prevention of election fraud and control of taxation;
- 9 therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
- 11 December 7, 2017, as "Great Law Day" in Pennsylvania in
- 12 commemoration of these historic actions of the first legislature
- 13 of Pennsylvania.
