A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Federal Government to allocate significant funds to
- 2 Pennsylvania to be used for Lyme disease research and data
- 3 surveillance.
- 4 WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a bacterial infection transmitted
- 5 primarily by ticks and is caused by the spirochete Borrelia
- 6 burgdorferi; and
- 7 WHEREAS, There are three main species of ticks in
- 8 Pennsylvania, which are the blacklegged tick, American dog tick
- 9 and lone star tick; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The only species that transmits the bacteria which
- 11 causes Lyme disease is the blacklegged tick, also referred to as
- 12 a deer tick; and
- 13 WHEREAS, For the last six years, this Commonwealth has been
- 14 ranked highest among all states in the number of confirmed cases
- 15 of Lyme disease; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In 2016, Pennsylvania reported 12,200 confirmed
- 17 cases of Lyme disease, although the Centers for Disease Control

- 1 and Prevention estimates that the actual cases of Lyme disease
- 2 can be up to 10 times greater than reported cases, indicating
- 3 that Pennsylvania could have up to 122,000 cases each year; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Lyme disease may cause early symptoms, including a
- 5 rash or flu-like symptoms such as fever, muscle aches, headaches
- 6 and fatigue, which can be easily misdiagnosed; and
- WHEREAS, Early clinical diagnosis and appropriate treatment
- 8 of tick-borne disorders and diseases may significantly reduce
- 9 the risks of continued, diverse and chronic symptoms, which may
- 10 adversely affect every system and organ of the human body and
- 11 often every aspect of an individual's life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Lyme disease poses a serious threat to the quality
- 13 of life of many Pennsylvanians; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In October 2016, the Pennsylvania Legislative Budget
- 15 and Finance Committee released a report on the cost estimates to
- 16 implement the recommendations of the Task Force on Lyme Disease
- 17 and Related Tick-Borne Diseases; and
- 18 WHEREAS, With respect to funding, the report highlights that
- 19 many states receive Federal funding, including grants, for
- 20 various Lyme disease projects and that Pennsylvania, in
- 21 comparison to other states, receives very little Federal funding
- 22 for these purposes; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Lack of funding leads to lack of data which in turn
- 24 leads to under-reporting and under-diagnosis; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Department of Health and Human Services National
- 26 Institutes of Health anticipates having a budget of \$22 million
- 27 this year for Lyme disease research; and
- 28 WHEREAS, It is currently unknown how much of this money will
- 29 be utilized or made available for grants to states or other
- 30 research entities; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Federal Government to
- 3 allocate significant funds from the anticipated \$22 million to
- 4 Pennsylvania to be used for Lyme disease research and data
- 5 surveillance; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That certified copies of this resolution be
- 7 transmitted to the President of the United States, the Vice
- 8 President of the United States, the Secretary of the United
- 9 States Department of Health and Human Services, the Director of
- 10 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and to each
- 11 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
