A RESOLUTION

- Urging the President of the United States to immediately reverse 2
- the administration's zero-tolerance, family-separation
- immigration policy which has led to the removal of more than
 - 2,000 migrant children from their parents' care and custody
- from April to May 2018. 5
- WHEREAS, In April 2018, United States Attorney General Jeff 6
- 7 Sessions announced a zero-tolerance policy for individuals
- 8 immigrating into the United States illegally along the southern
- border of the country; and
- WHEREAS, The policy set forth by the Department of Justice 10
- 11 criminally prosecutes individuals entering the United States,
- 12 many of whom are seeking asylum, and holds them in Federal
- 13 prisons to await deportation proceedings while sending their
- children to facilities maintained by the Department of Health 14
- 15 and Human Services; and
- WHEREAS, As of June 2018, nearly 12,000 migrant children, 16

- 1 some as young as 18 months old, who have had their greatest
- 2 fears of parental separation become reality, are being held in
- 3 Health and Human Services facilities scattered throughout 17
- 4 states; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Several of the facilities house groups of children
- 6 in cages built from metal fencing with little more than blankets
- 7 made of foil sheets, compelling them to care for one another;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, The facilities maintained by the Department of
- 10 Health and Human Services are nearing full capacity, leading the
- 11 department to consider the establishment of outdoor tent cities
- 12 on military bases to accommodate the increasing number of
- 13 unaccompanied children; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The living conditions that these children are being
- 15 forced to endure due to the administration's irresponsible
- 16 immigration policy are inhumane and heartless; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics has warned that
- 18 the deeply traumatic separation of child and parent may cause
- 19 irreparable harm to a child's psychological and physical health
- 20 as toxic stress may lead to inefficient or ineffective brain
- 21 development as well as long-term medical problems; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The administration's immigration policy not only
- 23 presents a moral and humanitarian crisis, but is also contrary
- 24 to the principles that this nation was built upon; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Abusing the basic human rights of innocent children
- 26 as political leverage to gain meaningful immigration policy
- 27 reform is an abhorrent tactic and should be ceased immediately;
- 28 therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 30 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the President of the United

- 1 States to immediately reverse the administration's zero-
- 2 tolerance, family-separation immigration policy which has led to
- 3 the removal of more than 2,000 migrant children from their
- 4 parents' care and custody from April to May 2018; and be it
- 5 further

- 8 and actively support policies keeping children with their
- 9 parents as they come to the United States; and be it further
