Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in matters affecting government units, further providing for exceptions to governmental immunity; and, in 3 4 preemptions, providing for municipality of refuge. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 8 Section 1. Section 8542 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: 10 § 8542. Exceptions to governmental immunity. 11 * * * 12 (a.1) Liability imposed on municipality of refuge. --Notwithstanding subsection (a), a municipality of refuge 13 14 shall be liable for damages on account of an injury to a 15 person or property within the limits set forth in this 16 subchapter if the injury was caused by the act of an individual that was in the custody, PURSUANT TO A LAWFUL 17

- 10 § 305. Municipality of refuge.
- 11 (a) Enforcement. The following shall enforce each law, <--
- 12 mandate, request and order of the Federal Government relating to
- 13 <u>immigration</u>, if the law, mandate, request or order does not
- 14 conflict with the rights quaranteed under the Constitution of
- 15 the United States or the Constitution of Pennsylvania:
- 16 <u>(1) The governing body of any municipality.</u>
- 17 (2) An officer or employee of any municipality.
- 18 <u>(3) A law enforcement official or a law enforcement</u>
- 19 <u>agency.</u>
- 20 <u>(4) A district attorney.</u>
- 21 (b) (A) Immigration. -- The governing body of any municipality <--
- 22 may not adopt a rule, order, ordinance or policy which prohibits
- 23 the enforcement of a Federal law or the laws of this
- 24 Commonwealth, pertaining to an immigrant or immigrations.
- 25 (c) Eliqibility. A law enforcement agency or municipality <--
- 26 that refuses to enforce an immigration order shall not be
- 27 eliqible:
- 28 <u>(1) for any State grant</u>; or
- 29 <u>(2) to participate in the sale of State surplus</u>

17	may be reinstated for eligibility by providing proof to the	
18	appropriate State agency that it is currently enforcing	
19	immigration orders and that it has rescinded any rule, order,	
20	ordinance or policy described under subsection (b) (A).	<
21	(e) Applicability. This section shall not apply to an	<
22	individual or entity under subsection (a) that has made an	
23	attempt to coordinate with a Federal agency pursuant to an	
24	immigration order to transfer the custody of a suspect in	
25	question but was unable to do so.	
26	(D) ENFORCEMENT EACH STATE AGENCY AND EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT	_<
27	OFFERING STATE GRANTS OR OVERSEEING THE SALE OF STATE SURPLUS	
28	PROPERTY TO MUNICIPALITIES SHALL REQUIRE EACH MUNICIPALITY TO	
29	VERIFY UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY THAT THE MUNICIPALITY IS NOT A	
30	MUNICIPALITY OF REFUGE AND IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A).	

- 1 (f) (E) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following <--
- 2 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 3 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Municipality." Any county, city, borough, incorporated
- 5 town, township, home rule municipality, optional plan
- 6 <u>municipality</u>, optional charter municipality or any similar
- 7 general purpose unit of government which may be created or
- 8 authorized by statute.
- 9 <u>"Municipality of refuge." A municipality that permits,</u> <--
- 10 REQUIRES OR REQUESTS the release of an individual in the custody
- 11 of the law enforcement agency of the municipality
- 12 notwithstanding the existence of a United States Immigration and
- 13 Customs Enforcement civil immigration detainer request for the
- 14 <u>individual</u>.
- 15 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
