1 2 3 4	Providing for museum preservation and for grant program; imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission; establishing the Pennsylvania Museum Preservation Fund; and making an appropriation.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
9	Museum Preservation Act.
10	Section 2. Definitions.
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"AAM." The American Alliance of Museums.
15	"Accredited museum." A museum that has been accredited by
16	the AAM.
17	"Commission." The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum
18	Commission.

"Core documents." A mission statement, code of ethics,
 strategic plan, disaster or emergency plan or collections
 management policy.

4 "Eligible museum." A museum meeting the criteria for grants5 under section 3.

6 "Fund." The Pennsylvania Museum Preservation Fund7 established under section 4.

8 Section 3. Grant program.

9 (a) Establishment.--The commission shall establish a program 10 to receive applications and award grants to eligible museums in 11 accordance with this act.

(b) Guidelines.--The commission shall establish guidelines that are consistent with the provisions of this act within 120 days of the effective date of this section. The guidelines shall be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and posted on the Internet website of the commission.

17 (c) Program requirements.--

18 (1) An eligible museum is a museum in one of the19 following categories:

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(i) Botanic garden or arboretum.

(iii) A general museum with two or more equallysignificant disciplines.

26 (vi) Historic house or site.

27 (vii) Military or maritime museum.

(xi) Science and technology center.

2 Multipurpose organization. An individual (xii) 3 museum within a multipurpose government or tax-exempt organization may apply for a grant if the museum 4 5 functions as a discrete unit with the parent organization. A museum that is part of a larger 6 7 organization must be deemed eligible if the museum: 8 (A) has administrative autonomy for its 9 operations; 10 has a fully segregated and itemized (B) 11 operating budget with the parent organization; 12 (C) may separately and distinctly fulfill the 13 eligibility and application requirements as defined 14 in the guidelines established under subsection (b); 15 and meets the AAM definition of a museum. 16 (D) 17 Eligible museums must also meet the following (2)18 standards: 19 (i) Funds may only be distributed by the commission 20 to eligible museums that commit to the AAM Pledge of 21 Excellence. 22 The requirement under subparagraph (i) must be (ii) 23 evidenced by the completion of core document verification 24 with the AAM within two years of the effective date of 25 this section. 26 (d) Grant limits. -- The commission may award grants to an eligible museum that meets the criteria of this section. The 27 28 grants may not exceed the following amounts: 29 An eligible museum with an operating budget of more (1)30 than \$100,000 may apply for grants equal to 15% of its

1 operating budget.

2 (2) A museum with AAM accreditation may receive an
3 additional grant of up to 1% of its operating budget.

4 (3) Grants, including additional grants under paragraph
5 (2), may not exceed \$500,000 in total for an eligible museum.
6 Section 4. Fund.

Establishment.--The Pennsylvania Museum Preservation 7 (a) Fund is established in the State Treasury as a special fund. 8 9 Appropriation.--Money in the fund is appropriated to the (b) commission for the purposes authorized under this act. 10 Transfer.--The Commonwealth shall annually transfer 11 (C) \$15,000,000 of the receipts deposited into the General Fund 12 under Article II of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), 13 known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, from the General Fund into 14 15 the fund. The transfer required under this subsection must be made by August 1. 16

17 Section 5. Effective date.

18 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
