A JOINT RESOLUTION

- Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for rights of victims of crime.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby resolves as follows:
- 5 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 6 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 7 That Article I be amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 <u>§ 9.1. Rights of victims of crime.</u>
- 9 (a) To secure for victims justice and due process throughout
- 10 the criminal and juvenile justice systems, a victim shall have
- 11 the following rights which shall be protected in a manner no
- 12 less vigorous than the rights afforded to the accused: to be
- 13 treated with fairness and respect for the victim's safety,
- 14 dignity and privacy; upon request, to reasonable and timely
- 15 notice, AS DEFINED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, of and to be present <--

- 1 <u>at all public proceedings involving the criminal or delinquent</u>
- 2 conduct; with the exception of grand jury proceedings, to be
- 3 heard in any proceeding involving WHERE A RIGHT OF THE VICTIM IS <--
- 4 <u>IMPLICATED</u>, <u>INCLUDING</u>, <u>BUT NOT LIMITED TO</u>, <u>release</u>, <u>plea</u>,
- 5 sentencing, disposition, parole and any proceeding during which <--
- 6 <u>a right of the victim is implicated PARDON; to reasonable</u> <--
- 7 protection from the accused or any person acting on behalf of
- 8 the accused; upon request, to reasonable notice, AS DEFINED BY <--
- 9 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, of any release or escape of an accused; to
- 10 refuse an interview, deposition or other discovery request made
- 11 by the accused or any person acting on behalf of the accused;
- 12 <u>full and timely restitution from the person or entity convicted</u>
- 13 or adjudicated responsible for the unlawful conduct; to
- 14 proceedings free from unreasonable delay and a prompt conclusion
- 15 of the case; upon request, to confer with the attorney for the
- 16 government; and to be informed of all rights enumerated in this
- 17 section.
- 18 (b) The victim, the victim's attorney or other lawful
- 19 representative, or the attorney for the government upon request
- 20 of the victim may assert in any trial or appellate court, or
- 21 before any other authority, with jurisdiction over the case, and
- 22 have enforced, the rights enumerated in this section and any
- 23 other right afforded to the victim by law. This section does not
- 24 GRANT THE VICTIM PARTY STATUS OR create any cause of action for <--
- 25 compensation or damages against the Commonwealth, counties,
- 26 cities or municipalities, nor any officer, employee or agent of
- 27 the Commonwealth, counties, cities or municipalities, or any
- 28 officer or employee of a court.
- 29 (c) As used in this section, the term "victim" includes any
- 30 person AS DEFINED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY against whom the

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- 1 <u>criminal offense or delinquent act is committed or who is</u>
- 2 directly harmed by the commission of the offense or act. The
- 3 term "victim" does not include the accused or a person whom the
- 4 court finds would not act in the best interests of a deceased,
- 5 <u>incompetent</u>, minor or incapacitated victim.
- 6 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 7 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
- 8 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 9 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 10 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 11 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 12 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 13 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.
- 14 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this
- 15 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the
- 16 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 17 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 18 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 19 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 20 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 21 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the
- 22 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment
- 23 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 24 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 25 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 26 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 27 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is
- 28 passed by the General Assembly.
