## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing for early intervention depression screening.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 1425. Early Intervention Depression Screening(a)
13	All children of school age shall receive a depression screening
14	while in sixth grade and thereafter in accordance with the
15	schedule for mandated medical examinations under section
16	1402(e). The comprehensive health examination for a child of
17	school age shall include written confirmation from the child's
18	physician or other qualified health care professional that the
19	screening was completed.
20	(b) All school entities of this Commonwealth shall ensure <

1	parents and guardians are effectively notified of the
2	requirement under subsection (a). The notice shall do all of the
3	following:
4	(B) EACH SCHOOL ENTITY SHALL PROVIDE NOTICE OF THE <
5	REQUIREMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) TO THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF
6	EACH CHILD. THE NOTICE SHALL BE DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
7	HEALTH AND MADE AVAILABLE ON THE SCHOOL ENTITY'S PUBLICLY
8	ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE OR INCLUDED IN ANY OTHER MATERIALS
9	USED TO EFFECTIVELY COMMUNICATE WITH PARENTS OR GUARDIANS
10	REGARDING THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENT AND SHALL:
11	(1) Explain that a physician or other qualified health care
12	professional shall conduct the depression screening as required
13	under subsection (a) and provide the school entity in which the
14	child is enrolled with written confirmation that the screening
15	was completed.
16	(2) State that a parent or guardian may opt out of the
17	depression screening required under subsection (a).
18	(3) Specify that the decision to act on screening results
19	rests entirely with the parent or guardian.
20	(4) State that the school entity will not receive the
21	results of the screening unless the parent or guardian chooses
22	to share the results of the screening with the school entity.
23	(5) State the following:
24	(i) If the parent or guardian chooses to share the results
25	of the screening with the school entity and the screening
26	indicates the presence of thoughts or behaviors often associated
27	with a diagnosis of depression, the school entity shall refer
28	the child:
29	(A) to the school's student assistance program;
30	(B) to the school psychologist for evaluation; or
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1	(C) for evaluation under the Individuals with Disabilities
2	Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq.) or
3	under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law
4	<u>93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 794).</u>
5	(ii) The parent or guardian shall be notified at the point
6	of referral and that an evaluation under this paragraph may not
7	be performed unless the parent or guardian consents to the
8	evaluation.
9	(c) The Department of Health, in conjunction with the
10	Department of Education, shall make available materials:
11	(1) That at a minimum explain the following:
12	(i) The importance of early diagnosis for mental health and
13	common challenges for students with undiagnosed or untreated
14	depression.
15	(ii) Related Federal and State privacy protections and
16	parental rights in relation to the health requirements of
17	children of school age.
18	(2) To school entities in print format, which shall also be
19	and posted on the publicly accessible Internet websites of the
20	Department of Health and the Department of Education.
21	(d) The academic records of a child of school age shall not
22	include the child's screening results or information indicating
23	whether a screening was completed.
24	(e) The Department of Health shall amend the standard
25	private or school physical examination of school age student
26	form to accommodate the depression screening required under
27	subsection (a). The form shall require the physician or other
28	qualified health care professional completing the form to
29	indicate confirmation that a depression screening was completed
30	or not completed or that the parent or guardian of the student
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1	opted out of the screening. The physician or other qualified
2	health care professional who completes the screening may use
3	this form or a form that provides substantially similar
4	information to provide confirmation of the screening or that the
5	parent or guardian has opted out of the screening to the school
6	entity of the child of school age.
7	(f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to create,
8	establish or expand civil or criminal liability on the part of a
9	school entity or school employe.
10	(g) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this
11	section, each school entity shall adopt or revise existing
12	procedures concerning the school entity's response if it is
13	provided with a depression screening indicating that a student
14	has thoughts or engages in behaviors that are often associated
15	with a diagnosis of depression.
16	(h) The Department of Health shall promulgate regulations
17	necessary to implement this section., INCLUDING A DETERMINATION $<$
18	OF WHO CAN BE DEEMED A QUALIFIED HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL FOR
19	THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION AND PRIVACY PROCEDURES THAT APPLY
20	WHEN DEPRESSION SCREENING IS CONDUCTED IN A SCHOOL ENTITY BY A
21	SCHOOL PHYSICIAN OR OTHER PRACTITIONER CONTRACTED FOR THE
22	PURPOSES OF CONDUCTING MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS UNDER SECTION
23	<u>1402(E).</u>
24	(i) As used in this section, "school entity" shall mean a
25	school district, charter school, cyber charter school, regional
26	charter school, area vocational-technical school, intermediate
27	unit or nonpublic school in this Commonwealth.
28	Section 2. This act shall take effect August 1, 2018.

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
