A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2017 as "Hydrocephalus Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Hydrocephalus is a condition in which an abnormal
- 4 accumulation of fluid in the cerebral ventricles causes
- 5 enlargement of the skull and compression of the brain,
- 6 destroying much of the neural tissue; and
- 7 WHEREAS, There is no medical therapy to treat hydrocephalus,
- 8 and the only effective treatments are surgical; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While many people are helped by surgery, many more
- 10 need further operations to stay well; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Out of more than 40,000 hydrocephalus operations
- 12 performed annually, only 30% are a patient's first surgery to
- 13 treat hydrocephalus; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The medical costs for treating hydrocephalus are
- 15 more than \$1 billion per year, yet the National Institutes of

- 1 Health invests less than \$1 million per year in hydrocephalus
- 2 treatment; and
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 1 million Americans are affected by
- 4 hydrocephalus from infancy to adulthood; and
- 5 WHEREAS, On average, 6,000 babies are born with hydrocephalus
- 6 every year, making it as common as Down syndrome and more common
- 7 than spina bifida or brain tumors; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Hydrocephalus is the most common reason for brain
- 9 surgery in children; and
- 10 WHEREAS, There are fewer than 10 treatment centers in the
- 11 United States that specialize in treating hydrocephalus in
- 12 adults; and
- WHEREAS, An estimated 375,000 adults over 60 years of age
- 14 have Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus, a disorder which often goes
- 15 undiagnosed and untreated; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Research suggests that treating hydrocephalus in the
- 17 elderly population would reduce United States health care
- 18 expenditures by \$25,000 per patient, or \$184 million, over a
- 19 five-year period; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Hydrocephalus also goes undiagnosed and untreated in
- 21 younger adults, leading to substantial work force loss and
- 22 health care costs; and
- 23 WHEREAS, At times, doctors are understandably reluctant to
- 24 take on complicated hydrocephalus cases, particularly in adults,
- 25 because little is known about the disorder; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Over the last 50 years, there has been no
- 27 significant improvement in hydrocephalus prevention and
- 28 treatment and no progress toward a cure; and
- 29 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is home to several renowned
- 30 medical institutions and other organizations working to increase

- 1 public awareness and develop new treatments that will improve
- 2 the lives of those who are affected by this condition; therefore
- 3 be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 5 2017 as "Hydrocephalus Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and call
- 6 upon all residents of this Commonwealth to observe this month by
- 7 participating in activities to raise awareness of hydrocephalus.
