A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating May 1, 2018, as "Pennsylvania Health Care
- Information Technology Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, United States health care spending increased 4.3% to
- 4 reach \$3.3 trillion, or \$10,348 per person, in 2016; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2016, the overall share of the gross domestic
- 6 product related to health care spending was 17.9%, up from 17.7%
- 7 in 2015; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Spending on health care has risen more than 40% in
- 9 the last decade; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The health care industry invests only 5% of revenue
- 11 on information technology and management systems versus an
- 12 average of 10.5% of other industries, including banking; and
- 13 WHEREAS, A recent study by the Commonwealth Fund has
- 14 demonstrated that the use of automated clinical decision support
- 15 systems can result in a net reduction of \$538 per patient per
- 16 hospital stay; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine reports that there are at

- 1 least 1.5 million preventable adverse drug events per year, each
- 2 adding more than \$8,700 to the cost of a hospital stay; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 4 reports that, between 2011 and 2015, 50,607 providers and
- 5 facilities in Pennsylvania received \$1.4 billion in Federal
- 6 incentive payments to implement electronic health records; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 2015, 97% of eligible hospitals and 56% of
- 8 ambulatory health care providers in Pennsylvania had adopted,
- 9 upgraded or demonstrated meaningful use of an electronic health
- 10 record system; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Health care providers in this Commonwealth report an
- 12 improved ability to recruit physicians coming out of medical
- 13 school when advanced information technology is deployed at their
- 14 worksites; and
- WHEREAS, Supporters and members of the Healthcare Information
- 16 and Management Systems Society encourage support for improved
- 17 access to care for rural Pennsylvanians through the expanded use
- 18 of telehealth by passing the Telemedicine Act, support funding
- 19 for workforce development programs to help increase the health
- 20 care and information technology workforce in Pennsylvania and
- 21 support the adoption of policies that promote interoperability
- 22 standards which enable cooperation by all provider communities
- 23 in Pennsylvania; therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 1, 2018, as
- 25 "Pennsylvania Health Care Information Technology Awareness Day"
- 26 in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the importance of raising
- 28 awareness of health care information technology and the
- 29 advancement of health information exchange to help improve the
- 30 quality of care, save lives and reduce the cost of health care

- 1 for all Pennsylvanians; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate welcome members and supporters of
- 3 the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society to the
- 4 State Capitol to promote better health care in this Commonwealth
- 5 through broader adoption of health care information technology
- 6 and the advancement of health information exchange.
