A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the week of May 13 through 19, 2018, as "National
2 Police Week" and designating May 7, 2018, as "Police
3 Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.

4 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of law enforcement within this
5 Commonwealth, hundreds of police officers have made the ultimate
6 sacrifice while in the line of duty, including Police Officer
7 Brian David Shaw, New Kensington Police Department and Trooper
8 Michael Paul Stewart, III, Pennsylvania State Police; and

9 WHEREAS, Police Officer Shawn D. Rager, City of Johnstown
10 Police Department, died October 13, 2016; and

11 WHEREAS, Deputy Sheriff Scot Alan Moyer, Lehigh County
12 Sheriff's Office, died September 23, 2009, of a heart attack
13 shortly after apprehending a man during a warrant service; and

14 WHEREAS, Across the United States, the week of May 13 through
15 19, 2018, is being recognized as "National Police Week"; and

16 WHEREAS, The first "National Police Officers' Memorial Day"

1 was held on May 15, 1982, following a proclamation signed by
2 President John F. Kennedy on October 1, 1962; and

3 WHEREAS, The observance continues to be held annually in
4 memory of those police officers who have made the ultimate
5 sacrifice in the line of duty; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the memory of the hundreds of
7 police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty
8 in this Commonwealth; and be it further

9 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the week of May 13
10 through 19, 2018, as "National Police Week" and designating May
11 7, 2018, as "Police Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
