## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Establishing a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative commission to recommend safety, oversight and interagency 2 coordination improvements for the transport of oil, natural 3 gas and other hazardous liquids through pipelines in this 4 Commonwealth and develop and promote legislation in 5 furtherance of its recommendations. 6 7 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth have a right to safe communities and benefit from regulations and laws which are established to enhance their safety and protect the environment; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, Natural gas and oil extraction have increased 12 dramatically over the last decade in this Commonwealth, 13 resulting in the construction of new pipeline infrastructure to 14 transport hazardous liquids, gases and byproducts in large 15 quantities through the most sensitive areas of this 16 Commonwealth; and 17 WHEREAS, While the construction and operation of any pipeline 18 carries some measure of risk, the public safety and environmental risks associated with the construction and 19 transport of volatile chemicals are compounded dramatically when 20

- 1 high volume pipelines operating under high pressure are situated
- 2 in close proximity to homes, schools and population centers; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The construction of pipelines throughout this
- 4 Commonwealth has resulted in hundreds of environmental and
- 5 safety violations that have negatively impacted the residents of
- 6 this Commonwealth, resulting in the contamination of private
- 7 wells and public waterways and demonstrating the need for
- 8 exploring measures that will result in improved management,
- 9 increased safety and more comprehensive oversight of pipeline
- 10 construction and operation; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED (the House of Representatives concurring), That the
- 12 General Assembly establish a special bipartisan, bicameral
- 13 legislative commission to recommend improvements to the process
- 14 of regulating pipeline construction and operation in this
- 15 Commonwealth and develop and promote legislation in furtherance
- 16 of its recommendations; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the commission consist of the following
- 18 members:
- 19 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 20 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate or
- 21 designees.
- 22 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 23 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 24 Representatives or designees.
- 25 (3) The Director of Regulatory Affairs of the
- 26 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission or a designee.
- 27 (4) The Director of the Bureau of Investigations and
- 28 Enforcement of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission or
- 29 a designee.
- 30 (5) The Director of the Environmental Emergency Response

- 1 Program of the Department of Environmental Protection or a
- 2 designee.
- 3 (6) The Deputy Secretary for Oil and Gas Management of 4 the Department of Environmental Protection or a designee.
- 5 (7) The president of the Marcellus Shale Coalition or a designee.
- 7 (8) The executive director of the Pipeline Safety 8 Coalition or a designee.
- 9 (9) The president of the Pennsylvania Municipal League 10 or a designee.
- 11 (10) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association 12 of Boroughs or a designee.
- 13 (11) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association 14 of Township Commissioners or a designee.
- 15 (12) The president of the Pennsylvania State Association 16 of Township Supervisors or a designee.
- 17 (13) The president of the Pennsylvania Association of 18 Hazardous Materials Technicians or a designee.
- 19 (14) Two fire chiefs of volunteer fire companies in this 20 Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President 21 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected 22 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 23 (15) Two fire chiefs of municipal fire companies in this 24 Commonwealth, one of whom shall be selected by the President 25 pro tempore of the Senate and one of whom shall be selected 26 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 27 (16) Four fire or emergency medical services members at-28 large, two of whom shall be selected by the President pro 29 tempore of the Senate and two of whom shall be selected by 30 the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

- 2 RESOLVED, That the commission elect a chair from its
- 3 membership; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the commission shall develop and recommend
- 5 legislation to improve the safety, oversight and interagency
- 6 coordination for pipelines in this Commonwealth; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the commission may hold hearings, take
- 9 testimony and make investigations at such places as it deems
- 10 necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 12 provide staff support to the commission and assist with the
- 13 final report; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the commission make a final report of all
- 15 legislative recommendations by January 1, 2019, which shall be
- 16 submitted to the chairperson of the Environmental Resources and
- 17 Energy Committee of the Senate and the chairperson of the
- 18 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 19 Representatives; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the members of the commission shall serve
- 21 without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all necessary
- 22 and reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 23 duties; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That reasonable expenses incurred by the commission
- 25 be equally divided between the Senate and the House of
- 26 Representatives; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the approval of the chairperson and minority
- 28 chairperson of the Environmental Resources and Energy Committee
- 29 of the Senate and the chairperson and minority chairperson of
- 30 the Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of

- 1 Representatives, by action of a majority of members of the
- 2 committees, shall be required to preauthorize all proposed
- 3 actions of the commission which will entail the expenditure of
- 4 State funds and shall also be required to approve all
- 5 expenditures, including expense reimbursement requests of
- 6 commission members, prior to payment.
