A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of October 22 through 26, 2018, as "School Bus Safety Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, "School Bus Safety Week" is recognized across the
4	United States to raise awareness and address the importance of
5	school bus safety; and
6	WHEREAS, Nationally, school bus ridership has grown to more
7	than 26 million and continues to provide a safe, critical
8	transportation service for children and teenagers in school; and
9	WHEREAS, The school bus remains the safest way to travel to
10	and from school; and
11	WHEREAS, Students are approximately 70 times more likely to
12	get to school safely if they take the school bus instead of
13	traveling by car; and
14	WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, school bus safety is a top
15	priority for the 1.5 million children who are transported on our
16	roads each day; and

WHEREAS, Students, parents, school officials, school bus
drivers and the motoring public all play an integral role in
keeping our children safe while on or around the school bus; and
WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law requires
motorists to obey the following:

6 (1) Stop when meeting or overtaking a stopped school bus 7 with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended.

8 (2) Stop when approaching an intersection where a school 9 bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm 10 extended.

11 (3) Stop at least 10 feet away from a school bus.

12 (4) Wait until the red lights have stopped flashing and13 the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving.

14 (5) Wait until all children have reached a place of 15 safety;

16 and

WHEREAS, Failure to obey the School Bus Stopping Law subjects offenders to a 60-day license suspension, 5 points on the offender's driving record and a \$250 fine; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 22 through 26, 2018, as "School Bus Safety Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Senate address the importance of schoolbus safety to ensure our children return home safely each day.
