15	Section 1. Section 333(f) of the act of June 27, 2006 (1st
16	Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, is
17	amended by adding a paragraph to read:
18	Section 333. Public referendum requirements for increasing

21	(f) Referendum exceptionsA school district may, without
22	seeking voter approval under subsection (c), increase the rate
23	of a tax levied for the support of the public schools by more

1 than the index if all of the following apply:

3	(3) A school district proceeding under the provisions of
4	this subsection shall hold two public hearings on the subject
5	of its intent to increase the rate of tax levied as proposed
6	under this subsection and subsection (n). At least one week
7	prior to the public hearings, the school district shall
8	publish notice of the hearings in a newspaper of general
9	circulation in the school district and on the school
10	district's publicly accessible Internet website, if one is
11	maintained. The notice shall include the purpose, date, time
12	and place of the public meetings. Each public meeting shall
13	be held on a weekday during an academic school week as
14	<u>follows:</u>
15	(i) One public meeting shall be held between the
16	hours of 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
17	(ii) One public meeting shall be held between the
18	hours of 3:30 p.m. and 10 p.m.

20	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
