AN ACT

Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in military educational programs, 2 3 further providing for definitions, for eligibility, for grants, for amount of grants, for limitations, for recoupment 4 of grant payments, for regulations, for administration and 5 for Educational Assistance Program Fund and providing for a 6 military family education program; and making editorial 7 8 changes. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Sections 3201, 3202(a) introductory paragraph and 11 12 (1), (b) and (c) introductory paragraph, (4) and (5), 3204 and 13 3205(a), (b), (b.1) and (c) of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania 14 Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 15 § 3201. Definitions. 16 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

1 context clearly indicates otherwise:

2 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance 3 Agency.

"Annual tuition rate." The in-State tuition rate established 4 or approved by May 1 of each year by the Board of Governors of 5 the State System of Higher Education. 6

"Approved institution of higher learning." An educational 7 8 institution offering a post-secondary program of education located in this Commonwealth and approved by the [Pennsylvania 9 10 Higher Education Assistance Agency] agency.

"Approved program of education." A [degree-] degree-granting 11 12 or certificate-granting curriculum [or course of study], course_ 13 of study or training required for entrance into a specific 14 <u>career</u> to be pursued on a full-time or part-time basis or its equivalent as determined by the [Pennsylvania Higher Education 15 16 Assistance Agency] agency, at an approved institution of higher 17 learning.

18 ["Combat zone." An area designated by Presidential executive 19 order as a combat zone as described in section 7508 of the 20 Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 21 7508).]

22 "Certificate of eligibility." A certificate from the 23 department that certifies an eligible member's eligibility for 24 an educational assistance grant.

25 "Costs of attendance." Allowable educational expenses, as 26 determined by the agency, that are consistent with the administration of the act of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546, 27 28 No.541), referred to as the Higher Education Scholarship Law. "Educational assistance." A benefit earned which shall be 29 given to an eligible member who has complied with all of the 30 20190HB1324PN1541

1 requirements provided for under this subchapter.

2 "Eligible member." A member of the Pennsylvania National 3 Guard who meets the criteria specified in section 3202 (relating 4 to eligibility) and who has been awarded a certificate of 5 eligibility under section 3203 (relating to certification of 6 eligibility).

"Full-time student." [A student] <u>An eligible member</u> enrolled
in an approved institution of higher learning pursuing an
approved program of education equal to or greater than [15] <u>12</u>
credit hours <u>per semester</u> or its equivalent <u>that is</u> recognized
by the [Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency] <u>agency</u>
as a full-time course of study.

13 "Fund." The Educational Assistance Program Fund.

14 "Part-time student." [A student] <u>An eligible member</u> enrolled 15 in an approved institution of higher education pursuing an 16 approved program of education of less than [15] <u>12</u> credit hours 17 <u>per semester</u> or its equivalent <u>that is</u> recognized by the 18 [Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency] <u>agency</u> as a 19 part-time course of study.

20 "Program." The Educational Assistance Program [established
21 in this subchapter].

["Qualified resident." An individual who has been a bona fide resident of this Commonwealth prior to the time an application for a grant is made. The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency shall make the final decision on whether an applicant is a qualified resident.]

27 <u>"Promissory note." A written contract signed by a member of</u> 28 <u>the Pennsylvania National Guard in which the member promises to</u> 29 repay the awarded grant amount.

(c) Discharge for disability incurred in the line of duty.-A [Pennsylvania National Guard] member who is discharged for
medical disability after September 11, 2001, shall remain
eligible to receive [a public service educational] an_

4 (4) The former member received an [honorable] <u>other than</u> 5 dishonorable discharge for medical reasons.
