## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, 2 revising, consolidating and changing the law relating 3 thereto," in township supervisors, further providing for 4 compensation of supervisors. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 606(a) of the act of May 1, 1933 8 (P.L.103, No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, is 10 amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to 11 read: 12 Section 606. Compensation of Supervisors. -- (a) Supervisors 13 may receive as compensation an amount established by ordinance 14 not in excess of the following: 15 Township Annual Maximum 16 Population Compensation 17 not more than 4,999 [\$1,875] <u>\$3,145</u> 18 5,000 to 9,999 [\$2,500] <u>\$4,190</u> 10,000 to 14,999 [\$3,250] <u>\$5,450</u>

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1	15,000 to 24,999	[\$4,125]	\$6,915
2	25,000 to 34,999	[\$4,375]	<u>\$7,335</u>
3	35,000 or more	[\$5 <b>,</b> 000]	<u>\$8,385</u>

- 4 Salaries are payable monthly or quarterly for the duties imposed
- 5 by this act. The population is determined by the latest official
- 6 census figures, except that no township shall be required to
- 7 reduce the salary of a supervisor as a result of a decrease in
- 8 population. The compensation of supervisors, when employed as
- 9 roadmasters, laborers, secretary, treasurer, assistant
- 10 secretary, assistant treasurer or in any employe capacity not
- 11 otherwise prohibited by this or any other act, shall be
- 12 determined by the board of auditors, at an hourly, daily,
- 13 weekly, semi-monthly or monthly basis, which shall be comparable
- 14 to compensation paid in the locality for similar services. The
- 15 board of supervisors may establish a mileage allowance, under
- 16 the act of July 20, 1979 (P.L.156, No.51), referred to as the
- 17 Uniform Mileage Fee Law, to be paid to officers and employes for
- 18 the use of a personal vehicle when required and actually used
- 19 for authorized township business. No supervisor may receive
- 20 compensation as an employe for attending a meeting of the board
- 21 of supervisors. Supervisors may continue to be compensated under
- 22 prior law until such time as an ordinance is enacted under this
- 23 act. Any change in salary, compensation or emoluments of the
- 24 elected office becomes effective at the beginning of the next
- 25 term of the supervisor. A decision by the township to pay, in
- 26 whole or in part, to include supervisors not employed by the
- 27 township in insurance plans, as authorized in subsection (c),
- 28 shall not be implemented with regard to any nonemploye
- 29 supervisor until the beginning of the next term of that
- 30 supervisor.

- 1 (a.1) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the board of
- 2 <u>supervisors may provide that a supervisor shall receive</u>
- 3 compensation on a per-meeting basis based on attendance of
- 4 <u>supervisors</u>. Total annual compensation may not exceed the
- 5 <u>amounts specified in subsection (a). Compensation shall only be</u>
- 6 payable for duly advertised public meetings in which a
- 7 <u>supervisor participated</u>. If the board of supervisors has
- 8 provided that supervisors shall receive compensation on a per-
- 9 meeting basis, the board of supervisors may provide for the
- 10 <u>forfeiture of up to one-twelfth of the annual compensation of a</u>
- 11 <u>supervisor or impose another appropriate penalty for each</u>
- 12 unexcused absence from a regularly scheduled meeting.

- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
