AN ACT

Amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), entitled 1 "An act providing for planning for the processing and 2 disposal of municipal waste; requiring counties to submit 3 plans for municipal waste management systems within their 4 boundaries; authorizing grants to counties and municipalities 5 for planning, resource recovery and recycling; imposing and 6 7 collecting fees; establishing certain rights for host municipalities; requiring municipalities to implement 8 recycling programs; requiring Commonwealth agencies to 9 procure recycled materials; imposing duties; granting powers 10 to counties and municipalities; authorizing the Environmental 11 Quality Board to adopt regulations; authorizing the 12 Department of Environmental Resources to implement this act; 13 providing remedies; prescribing penalties; establishing a 14 fund; and making repeals," in recycling and waste reduction, 15 further providing for Commonwealth recycling and waste 16 17 reduction. 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
