AN ACT

1	Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), entitled "An
2	act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying
3	and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing
4	taxes thereon; providing procedures for the payment,
5	collection, administration and enforcement thereof; providing
6	for tax credits in certain cases; conferring powers and
7	imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, certain
8	employers, fiduciaries, individuals, persons, corporations
9	and other entities; prescribing crimes, offenses and
10	penalties," providing for the Public School Building
11	Emergency Repair and Renovation Grant Program; establishing
12	the Public School Building Emergency Repair and Renovation
13	Grant Fund; and making an appropriation.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
17	the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by adding an article to
18	read:
19	<u>ARTICLE XI-E</u>
20	PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING EMERGENCY REPAIR
21	AND RENOVATION GRANT PROGRAM

1	Section 1101-E. Scope.
2	This article relates to the Public School Building Emergency
3	Repair and Renovation Grant Program.
4	<u>Section 1102-E. Definitions.</u>
5	The following words and phrases when used in this article
6	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
7	context clearly indicates otherwise:
8	"Department." The Department of Education of the
9	Commonwealth.
10	"Eligible cost." The term includes the cost of all labor,
11	materials, necessary operational machinery and equipment, plans
12	and specifications, surveys, prefeasibility studies, engineering
13	and other professional services related to an emergency repair
14	and renovation project.
15	"Emergency repair and renovation projects." Eligible costs
16	associated with the improvement, repair, rehabilitation or
17	renovation of all or part of a public school building, which
18	include the following:
19	(1) Emergency repairs resulting from a natural or
20	<u>manmade disaster.</u>
21	(2) Lead abatement, remediation and removal.
22	(3) Asbestos abatement, remediation and removal.
23	(4) Heating, ventilation and air conditioning purchase,
24	<u>repair or replacement.</u>
25	(5) Electrical system repair or replacement.
26	(6) Roof and window repair or replacement.
27	(7) Plumbing repairs or replacement.
28	(8) Purchase, repair or replacement of indoor air
29	quality systems.
30	(9) Removal of the presence of toxins, chemicals and

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1	health hazards, including mercury, radon, PCBs, mold, mildew,
2	rodents and pests.
3	(10) Repairs or renovations that ensure the building
4	envelopes of public school buildings protect occupants and
5	interiors from the elements and are structurally sound and
6	secure.
7	(11) Repairs or renovations that ensure the safety of
8	drinking water and water used for meal preparation in public
9	school buildings, which may include testing of the potability
10	of water for the presence of lead and other contaminants.
11	(12) Repairs or renovations that bring public school
12	facilities into compliance with applicable fire, health and
13	<u>safety codes.</u>
14	(13) Other improvements, actions, repairs or renovations
15	that will improve the physical health, welfare and safety of
16	students as approved by the department.
17	"Fund." The Public School Building Emergency Repair and
18	Renovation Grant Fund established under section 1104-E.
19	"School district." As defined in section 102 of the act of
20	March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
21	<u>of 1949.</u>
22	Section 1103-E. Public School Building Emergency Repair and
23	Renovation Grant Program.
24	(a) EstablishmentThe Public School Building Emergency
25	Repair and Renovation Grant Program is established and shall be
26	administered by the department.
27	(b) ApplicationA school district may submit a single
28	application in writing to the department which identifies each
29	project for which grant funding is requested under this section.
30	The department may establish the form and manner in which an
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1 <u>application is submitted.</u>

2	(c) Requirements of applicationAn application submitted
3	under subsection (b) shall include:
4	(1) A detailed plan of each emergency repair and
5	renovation project for which the school district is seeking
6	funding.
7	(2) The total amount of grant funding requested.
8	(3) A statement indicating that the emergency repair and
9	renovation project is necessary to protect the health and
10	safety of the students in the school district.
11	(4) Any other information required by the department.
12	(d) ReviewWithin 30 days of receipt of an application,
13	the department shall review and approve or deny the application.
14	If the application is approved, the department shall award the
15	grant and execute a grant agreement with the school district. If
16	the application is denied, the department shall forward the
17	reasons for denial to the applicant and allow the applicant to
18	reapply.
19	Section 1104-E. Public School Building Emergency Repair and
20	Renovation Grant Fund.
21	There is established in the State Treasury a special fund to
22	be known as the Public School Building Emergency Repair and
23	Renovation Grant Fund.
24	<u>Section 1105-E. Use of money.</u>
25	(a) GrantsMoney in the fund may only be used for grants
26	to school districts for emergency repair and renovation projects
27	approved under section 1103-E(d).
28	(b) DistributionMoney in the fund shall be distributed as
29	<u>follows:</u>
30	(1) The sum of \$85,000,000 shall be allocated for grants

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1	for emergency repair and renovation projects in a school
2	district of the first class.
3	(2) The sum of \$30,000,000 shall be used for grants for
4	emergency repair and renovation projects in school districts,
5	except school districts of the first class, that are in one
6	of the following categories:
7	(i) In financial recovery status under Subchapter C
8	of Article VI-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
9	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
10	(ii) In financial watch status under Subchapter B of
11	Article VI-A of the Public School Code of 1949.
12	(iii) With 20% or more of school-age children
13	identified as in acute poverty by the American Community
14	Survey data, as used in section 2502.53 of the Public
15	<u>School Code of 1949.</u>
16	(3) The sum of \$10,000,000 shall be used for grants for
17	emergency repair and renovation projects in school districts
18	other than those identified in paragraphs (1) and (2).
19	(c) ProhibitionThe department may not award grants for
20	any of the following purposes:
21	(1) Construction of a new public school building.
22	(2) Payment of maintenance costs other than those
23	allowed in this article.
24	(3) Purchase, lease or upgrade of school district
25	vehicles.
26	(4) Improvement of a stand-alone facility which is not
27	used for the purpose of educating children, including
28	administrative or operations buildings or logistical support
29	facilities.
30	(d) GuidelinesThe department shall develop guidelines for

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1	the following:
2	(1) Submitting applications for a grant.
3	(2) Reviewing applications and selecting projects for
4	the awarding of grants.
5	(3) Eligible uses of money by school districts that
6	receive grants.
7	(4) Minimum grant amounts.
8	<u>Section 1106-E. Amount of grant.</u>
9	Maximum grant amounts for a school district shall be as
10	follows:
11	(1) \$2,000,000 for school districts under section 1105-
12	<u>E(b)(2).</u>
13	(2) \$500,000 for school districts under section 1105-
14	<u>E(b)(3).</u>
15	Section 1107-E. Deposit and transfer of money.
16	<u>On July 1, 2019, the sum of \$125,000,000 shall be transferred</u>
17	from the General Fund for deposit into the fund for purposes of
18	awarding grants under this article.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
