## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for tuition assistance for active volunteers; and establishing the Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Program and Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Fund.

- 1 79B01. Definitions.
- 2 § 79B01. Definitions.
- 3 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 4 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 5 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 6 <u>"Active volunteer." A volunteer for a volunteer organization</u>
- 7 who satisfies the eligibility criteria under section 79B12(a)
- 8 (relating to eligibility), receives a certificate of eligibility
- 9 and complies with the requirements of the program.
- 10 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 11 Agency.
- 12 "Annual tuition rate." The in-State tuition rate, including
- 13 a technology tuition fee, established or approved by May 1 of
- 14 each year by the Board of Governors of the State System of
- 15 Higher Education.
- 16 <u>"Approved institution of higher learning." An educational</u>
- 17 institution offering a postsecondary program of education
- 18 located in this Commonwealth and approved by the agency.
- "Approved program of education." A degree-granting or
- 20 <u>certificate-granting curriculum, course of study or training</u>
- 21 program required for entrance into a specific career to be
- 22 pursued on a full-time or part-time basis or its equivalent as
- 23 determined by the agency, at an approved institution of higher
- 24 learning.
- 25 "Certificate of eligibility." A certificate issued by the
- 26 agency under section 79B12(b) that certifies that an active
- 27 <u>volunteer satisfies the eligibility criteria under section</u>
- 28 <u>79B12(a)</u>.
- 29 "Eligible student." An active volunteer who is enrolled in
- 30 an approved institution of higher learning.

- 1 "Emergency medical services agency." As defined in section
- 2 <u>8103 (relating to definitions).</u>
- 3 "Full-time student." An eligible student pursuing no less
- 4 than 12 credit hours per semester of an approved program of
- 5 education or its equivalent that is recognized by the agency as
- 6 a full-time course of study.
- 7 "Fund." The Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Fund
- 8 <u>established under under section 79B21(a) (relating to Active</u>
- 9 <u>Volunteer Tuition Assistance Program Fund).</u>
- 10 "Part-time student." An eligible student pursuing less than
- 11 12 credit hours per semester of an approved program of education
- 12 or its equivalent that is recognized by the agency as a
- 13 part-time course of study.
- 14 "Program." The Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Program
- 15 <u>established under section 79B11 (relating to establishment).</u>
- 16 "Technology tuition fee." A separate tuition fee established
- 17 by the Board of Governors of the State System of Higher
- 18 Education for rendering technology resources and services to
- 19 enhance student learning experiences.
- 20 "Tuition assistance." Reimbursement provided by the agency
- 21 for tuition under the program.
- 22 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
- 23 association or organization located in this Commonwealth that
- 24 provides fire protection services and may offer other voluntary
- 25 emergency services within this Commonwealth.
- 26 "Volunteer organization." A volunteer fire company or
- 27 emergency medical services agency.

- 13 § 79B11. Establishment.
- 14 The Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Program is
- 15 established within the agency to provide tuition assistance to
- 16 <u>active volunteers with volunteer organizations who are students</u>
- 17 at approved institutions of higher learning.
- 18 § 79B12. Eligibility.
- 19 (a) Criteria. -- Upon submitting an application to participate
- 20 in the program in accordance with the agency's regulations,
- 21 <u>rules or guidelines under section 79B22 (relating to</u>
- 22 regulations), an individual shall be eliqible to receive tuition
- 23 assistance if the individual satisfies all of the following
- 24 eligibility criteria:
- 25 (1) Is a resident of this Commonwealth.
- 26 <u>(2) Is an active volunteer.</u>
- 27 (3) Has participated in not less than 30% of a volunteer
- 28 organization's activities within the one-year period before
- 29 the individual submitted an application to the agency for
- 30 tuition assistance. The activities may include, but not be

- limited to, training, drills, emergency response calls,
- 2 <u>administrative and operational support, fundraising or other</u>
- 3 events and projects that aid the financial viability of the
- 4 <u>volunteer organization.</u>
- 5 <u>(4) Has enrolled as a student in an approved program of</u>
- 6 <u>education at an approved institution of higher learning.</u>
- 7 (5) Accepts an obligation to serve as an active
- 8 <u>volunteer with a volunteer organization for at least one year</u>
- 9 prior to enrolling in an approved program of education and at
- least five years after completing an approved program of
- 11 <u>education</u>.
- 12 (6) Has signed a promissory note obligating the
- 13 <u>individual to repay the full amount of tuition assistance</u>
- received by the individual if the individual fails to satisfy
- the requirements under the program.
- 16 (7) Is in good standing with the volunteer organization
- for which the individual is an active volunteer.
- 18 (b) Certificate. -- The agency shall issue a certificate of
- 19 eligibility to an individual who satisfies the eligibility
- 20 criteria under subsection (a).
- 21 § 79B13. Tuition assistance.
- 22 From funds appropriated for the program, tuition assistance
- 23 <u>shall be provided to eligible students to pursue approved</u>
- 24 programs of education on or after the effective date of this
- 25 section.
- 26 § 79B14. Promissory note.
- 27 <u>Before participating in the program, an individual must sign</u>
- 28 a promissory note obligating the individual to repay the full
- 29 <u>amount of the tuition assistance received by the individual if</u>
- 30 the individual fails to satisfy the requirements under the

- 1 program as specified under section 79B17 (relating to recoupment
- 2 <u>of tuition assistance payments).</u>
- 3 § 79B15. Amount of tuition payments.
- 4 (a) Full-time students. -- Payments of tuition assistance to a
- 5 <u>full-time student shall be determined by the agency and may not</u>
- 6 exceed the lesser of the following for an academic year:
- 7 (1) The tuition rate charged by the approved institution
- 8 <u>of higher learning for the number of credit hours per</u>
- 9 <u>semester or its equivalent for the approved program of</u>
- 10 education in which the full-time student is enrolled.
- 11 (2) The annual tuition rate charged by an institution
- 12 <u>within the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education for</u>
- 13 <u>the academic year.</u>
- 14 (b) Part-time students. -- Payments of tuition assistance to a
- 15 part-time student shall be determined by the agency and may not
- 16 exceed the lesser of the following for an academic year:
- 17 (1) The tuition rate charged by the approved institution
- of higher learning for the number of credit hours per
- 19 <u>semester or its equivalent in which the part-time student is</u>
- 20 enrolled.
- 21 (2) The annual tuition rate charged by an institution
- 22 within the State System of Higher Education for the number of
- 23 credit hours per semester or its equivalent in which the
- 24 part-time student is enrolled for the same academic year or
- 25 period.
- 26 (c) Limit on charges.--An eligible student who attends an
- 27 <u>institution within the State System of Higher Education may not</u>
- 28 be charged tuition exceeding the annual tuition rate.
- 29 § 79B16. Limitation on tuition assistance.
- 30 An eligible student shall not receive tuition assistance for

- 1 <u>a total of more than five academic years or an equivalent amount</u>
- 2 of time as determined by the agency.
- 3 § 79B17. Recoupment of tuition assistance payments.
- 4 (a) Noncompliance. -- An individual who fails to satisfy the
- 5 requirements under the program shall be liable to the
- 6 Commonwealth for the full amount of tuition assistance received
- 7 by the individual, unless the failure is a result of an injury
- 8 while responding to an emergency as an active volunteer that
- 9 prevents the individual from complying with the requirements
- 10 under the program. The promissory note under section 79B14
- 11 (relating to promissory note) shall be repaid by the individual
- 12 upon demand by the agency on a schedule as the agency may
- 13 determine.
- 14 (b) Notice. -- A volunteer organization shall notify the
- 15 agency if an active volunteer fails to satisfy the volunteer
- 16 <u>requirements under the program.</u>
- 17 § 79B18. Service records.
- 18 (a) Logs. -- For the purpose of ensuring compliance with the
- 19 requirements under the program, the chief of a volunteer fire
- 20 company or the supervisor or chief of an emergency medical
- 21 services agency or their designees shall establish and maintain
- 22 a service log that documents the services provided by an active
- 23 volunteer participating in the program, including a calculation
- 24 of the amount of time the active volunteer conducts activities
- 25 with the volunteer organization.
- 26 (b) Review.--Service logs under subsection (a) shall be
- 27 <u>subject to periodic review by the agency and the Department of</u>
- 28 Auditor General for the purpose of ensuring compliance with the
- 29 <u>requirements under this subchapter.</u>
- 30 § 79B19. Verification of active volunteer status.

- 1 (a) Self-certification. -- An individual shall sign and submit
- 2 an application to the chief of a volunteer fire company or the
- 3 supervisor or chief of the emergency medical services agency to
- 4 <u>attest that the individual is an active volunteer.</u>
- 5 (b) Injured volunteer. -- Notwithstanding the volunteer
- 6 requirements under the program, an individual who was injured
- 7 while responding to an emergency as an active volunteer who can
- 8 no longer serve as an active volunteer because of the injury and
- 9 who would otherwise be eliqible for the program shall be
- 10 eligible to participate in the program for five years from the
- 11 date of the injury.
- 12 (c) Local sign-off.--The chief and another officer of the
- 13 volunteer fire company and the supervisor or chief and another
- 14 officer of the emergency medical services agency shall sign the
- 15 application attesting that the individual is an active volunteer
- 16 under subsection (a) or that the individual can no longer serve
- 17 as an active volunteer due to injury under subsection (b). The
- 18 application shall then be forwarded to the agency for final
- 19 review and processing.
- 20 § 79B20. Administrative costs.
- 21 The administrative costs of the program for the fiscal year
- 22 beginning July 1, 2020, and each fiscal year thereafter shall
- 23 not exceed 3.5% of the total amount of money appropriated to the
- 24 agency to implement the program.
- 25 § 79B21. Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance Program Fund.
- 26 (a) Establishment. -- The Active Volunteer Tuition Assistance
- 27 Program Fund is established as a nonlapsing restricted receipts
- 28 account in the State Treasury.
- 29 (b) Appropriation. -- Money deposited or transferred into the
- 30 fund, including any accrued interest, is appropriated to the

- 1 agency on a continuing basis to implement the program.
- 2 (c) Administrative actions. -- No administrative action shall
- 3 prevent the deposit or transfer of money into the fund.
- 4 (d) Use. -- Money in the fund may only be used to implement
- 5 the program. Money in the fund may not be diverted for
- 6 any other purpose by administrative action.
- 7 § 79B22. Regulations.
- 8 The agency shall promulgate regulations and establish rules
- 9 or guidelines to administer this subchapter.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 11 (1) The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. § 79B21 shall take effect
- July 1, 2020, or immediately, whichever is later.
- 13 (2) The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. §§ 79B13 and 79B15 shall
- take effect August 1, 2020, or immediately, whichever is
- 15 later.
- 16 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect
- immediately.
