AN ACT

- Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the Firefighter Educational Assistance Program; and establishing the Firefighter Educational Assistance Program Fund. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. - 6 § 79B01. Definitions.
- 7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 9 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 10 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 11 Agency.
- 12 "Annual tuition rate." The in-State tuition rate, including
- 13 <u>a technology tuition fee, established or approved by May 1 of</u>
- 14 each year by the Board of Governors of the State System of
- 15 Higher Education.
- 16 <u>"Approved institution of higher learning." An educational</u>
- 17 institution offering a postsecondary program of education
- 18 located in this Commonwealth and approved by the agency.
- "Approved program of education." A degree-granting or
- 20 certificate-granting curriculum, course of study or training
- 21 program required for entrance into a specific career to be
- 22 pursued on a full-time or part-time basis, or its equivalent, as
- 23 determined by the agency, at an approved institution of higher
- 24 learning.
- 25 "Certificate of eligibility." A certificate issued by the
- 26 State Fire Commissioner that certifies a member's eligibility to
- 27 <u>receive a grant.</u>
- 28 "Costs of attendance." Allowable educational expenses, as
- 29 <u>determined by the agency</u>, that are consistent with the
- 30 administration of the act of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546,

- 1 No.541), referred to as the Higher Education Scholarship Law.
- 2 <u>"Educational assistance." A benefit earned which shall be</u>
- 3 granted to an eligible member who has complied with all of the
- 4 <u>requirements provided for under this chapter.</u>
- 5 <u>"Eliqible member." A member of a fire company who meets the</u>
- 6 <u>criteria specified in section 79B03 (relating to eligibility)</u>
- 7 and who has been awarded a certificate of eligibility under
- 8 section 79B04 (relating to certification of eligibility).
- 9 <u>"Fire company." A volunteer fire company or a municipal fire</u>
- 10 company located in this Commonwealth.
- 11 <u>"Full-time student." An eligible member enrolled in an</u>
- 12 approved institution of higher learning pursuing an approved
- 13 program of education equal to or greater than 12 credit hours
- 14 per semester or its equivalent that is recognized by the agency
- 15 as a full-time course of study.
- 16 <u>"Fund." The Firefighter Educational Assistance Program Fund</u>
- 17 established in section 79B11 (relating to fund).
- 18 "Grant." An educational assistance grant under this chapter.
- 19 "Member." A member of a fire company.
- 20 "Part-time student." An eligible member enrolled in an
- 21 approved institution of higher learning pursuing an approved
- 22 program of education of less than 12 credit hours per semester
- 23 or its equivalent that is recognized by the agency as a part-
- 24 time course of study.
- 25 <u>"Program." The Firefighter Educational Assistance Program</u>
- 26 established in section 79B02 (relating to program).
- 27 <u>"Promissory note." A written contract signed by a member in</u>
- 28 which the member promises to repay the awarded grant amount.
- 29 "Qualified resident." An individual who has been a bona fide
- 30 resident of this Commonwealth prior to the time an application

- 1 for a grant is made. The agency shall make the final decision on
- 2 whether an applicant is a qualified resident.
- 3 "Service obligation." The service obligation provided for
- 4 <u>under section 79B03(b)(2) (relating to eligibility).</u>
- 5 <u>"Technology tuition fee." A separate tuition fee established</u>
- 6 by the Board of Governors of the State System of Higher
- 7 Education for rendering technology resources and services to
- 8 <u>enhance student learning experiences.</u>
- 9 <u>§ 79B02. Program.</u>
- 10 The Firefighter Educational Assistance Program is established
- 11 to provide educational assistance to eligible firefighters in
- 12 the form of grants. The program shall be administered by the
- 13 State Fire Commissioner in accordance with this chapter.
- 14 § 79B03. Eligibility.
- 15 (a) General rule. -- A member is eligible to receive a grant
- 16 <u>if the member meets all of the following eligibility criteria:</u>
- 17 (1) The member is a qualified resident of this
- 18 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 19 (2) The member is in good standing with a fire company
- in this Commonwealth for a minimum service period established
- 21 by the State Fire Commissioner.
- 22 (3) The member has completed the required firefighter
- 23 <u>training established by the State Fire Commissioner.</u>
- 24 (b) Additional eligibility criteria for full-time
- 25 <u>educational assistance grants.--In addition to the eligibility</u>
- 26 criteria specified in subsection (a), a member must meet the
- 27 <u>following eligibility criteria to qualify for a full-time</u>
- 28 educational assistance grant:
- 29 <u>(1) The member does not possess a baccalaureate degree.</u>
- 30 (2) The member accepts an obligation to serve in a fire

- 1 <u>company in this Commonwealth for a period of six years from</u>
- 2 <u>the date of entry into the program.</u>
- 3 (3) The member has enrolled as a full-time student in an
- 4 <u>approved program of education at an approved institution of</u>
- 5 <u>higher learning.</u>
- 6 § 79B04. Certification of eligibility.
- 7 The State Fire Commissioner shall certify firefighters as
- 8 <u>eliqible to participate in the program who meet the eliqibility</u>
- 9 criteria set forth in section 79B03 (relating to eligibility)
- 10 and shall provide the agency with a certificate of eligibility
- 11 <u>for an eligible member.</u>
- 12 § 79B05. Grants.
- 13 <u>(a) General rule.--From the funds appropriated for the</u>
- 14 purposes of this chapter, grants shall be provided to eligible
- 15 members for the purpose of pursuing approved programs of
- 16 education.
- 17 (b) Promissory notes.--Upon receipt of a grant, an eligible
- 18 member shall sign a promissory note obligating the eligible
- 19 member to repay the full amount of the grant in accordance with
- 20 section 79B08(a) (relating to recoupment of grant payments) if
- 21 the eliquible member fails to fulfill the service obligation or
- 22 to meet other requirements under this chapter.
- 23 § 79B06. Amount of grants.
- 24 (a) Full-time educational assistance grants.--Grants awarded
- 25 to full-time students shall be determined by the agency without
- 26 regard to financial need and shall not exceed for each academic
- 27 <u>year the lesser of:</u>
- 28 (1) the tuition rate of the approved institution of
- 29 higher learning for the number of credit hours per semester
- or its equivalent for the approved program of education in

- 1 which the eligible member is enrolled; or
- 2 (2) the annual tuition rate charged by a State System of
- 3 Higher Education institution for the academic year.
- 4 (b) Part-time educational assistance grants.--Grants awarded
- 5 to part-time students who may or may not possess a baccalaureate
- 6 degree shall be determined by the agency without regard to
- 7 <u>financial need and shall not exceed for each academic year or</u>
- 8 period the lesser of:
- 9 (1) the tuition charged by the approved institution of
- 10 <u>higher learning for the number of credit hours per semester</u>
- or its equivalent in which the eligible member is enrolled;
- 12 <u>or</u>
- 13 (2) the annual tuition rate charged by a State System of
- Higher Education institution for the number of credit hours
- per semester or its equivalent in which the eligible member
- is enrolled for the same academic year or period.
- 17 (c) Other grants and financial aid. --
- 18 (1) The agency shall not reduce the amount of other
- 19 <u>agency grants or aid for which the eligible member qualifies</u>
- on account of the eligible member's eligibility for or
- 21 <u>receipt of grants under this chapter.</u>
- 22 (2) Prior to making a grant, the approved institution of
- 23 higher learning shall first consider any Federal tuition
- 24 assistance received by the eliqible member and shall award a
- 25 grant if the eligible member requires additional financial
- aid to cover the costs of attendance for an approved program
- 27 of education. A grant shall be paid or refunded to the
- 28 eligible member for the costs of attendance. Grants
- 29 authorized under this chapter shall be reduced so that the
- 30 total of all Federal and State aid does not exceed 100% of

- 1 the costs of attendance.
- 2 (d) Adjustments. -- If the agency and the State Fire
- 3 Commissioner determine that the amount appropriated for the
- 4 program in any year will be insufficient to provide grants in
- 5 the amounts set forth in this section to all eligible members,
- 6 the agency and the State Fire Commissioner may reduce the
- 7 maximum amount of the grants proportionately or set a limit on
- 8 the number of participants to ensure that sums expended do not
- 9 <u>exceed appropriations.</u>
- 10 (e) Limit on charges. -- Eligible members attending a State
- 11 System of Higher Education institution shall not be charged
- 12 <u>additional tuition above the annual tuition rate.</u>
- 13 § 79B07. Limitations.
- 14 (a) Time. -- No eligible member shall be eligible for full-
- 15 time or part-time educational assistance or a combination
- 16 thereof under this chapter for a total of more than five
- 17 academic years or their equivalent as determined by the agency.
- 18 (b) Limit on tuition.--At no time may a State System of
- 19 Higher Education institution charge an eligible member more than
- 20 the in-State rate.
- 21 § 79B08. Recoupment of grant payments.
- 22 (a) General rule. -- An eligible member who fails to meet the
- 23 service obligation or to meet other requirements established by
- 24 the State Fire Commissioner or the agency is liable to the
- 25 Commonwealth for repayment of all or part of any grant payments
- 26 made. The State Fire Commissioner shall notify the agency if an
- 27 eligible member fails to complete the service obligation, and
- 28 the promissory note under section 79B05(b) (relating to grants)
- 29 shall be repaid by the eligible member upon demand by the agency
- 30 on a schedule as the agency may determine.

- 1 (b) Forgiveness of recoupment. -- The State Fire Commissioner
- 2 shall notify the agency and the agency shall forgive recoupment
- 3 <u>of all or part of an eligible member's grant payments if the</u>
- 4 State Fire Commissioner determines that the eligible member's
- 5 failure to fulfill the service obligation is the result of one
- 6 of the following:
- 7 <u>(1) Death or disability.</u>
- 8 (2) Medical determination that the eligible member is
- 9 <u>medically unable to perform the member's duties as a</u>
- firefighter when the medical condition is outside the
- 11 member's control and is not due to the member's misconduct.
- 12 (3) The existence of other compelling circumstances that
- 13 <u>warrant forgiveness.</u>
- 14 § 79B09. Regulations.
- The State Fire Commissioner and the agency may promulgate
- 16 regulations to carry out the provisions of this chapter.
- 17 § 79B10. Appropriation and administrative costs.
- 18 (a) Appropriation. -- Beginning with the 2020-2021 fiscal
- 19 year, the General Assembly shall appropriate funds to pay full-
- 20 time and part-time educational assistance grants. A portion of
- 21 the money appropriated may be used to pay the costs of the
- 22 administration of this chapter.
- 23 (b) Limitation.--Administrative costs for the fiscal year
- 24 beginning on July 1, 2020, and each fiscal year thereafter,
- 25 shall not exceed 3.5% of the total amount of funds appropriated.
- 26 § 79B11. Fund.
- 27 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Firefighter Educational Assistance</u>
- 28 Program Fund is established as a special nonlapsing fund in the
- 29 <u>State Treasury.</u>
- 30 (b) Appropriation.--All money deposited into the fund and

- 1 the interest the fund accrues are appropriated to the State Fire
- 2 Commissioner on a continuing basis to be used for the purposes
- 3 provided for under this chapter.
- 4 (c) Administrative action prohibited. -- No administrative
- 5 action shall prevent the deposit of money into the fund in the
- 6 <u>fiscal year in which the money is received.</u>
- 7 (d) Use. -- The fund may only be used for the purposes
- 8 provided for under this chapter, and no money in the fund may be
- 9 transferred or diverted to any other purpose by administrative
- 10 action.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
