1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ethics standards and financial disclosure, further providing for definitions, providing for gift ban and for gift ban exceptions and further providing for statement of financial interests.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. The definition of "person" in section 1102 of
9	Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended
10	and the section is amended by adding definitions to read:
11	§ 1102. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
13	shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
14	meanings given to them in this section:
15	* * *
16	"Cash." United States currency and coin and foreign currency
17	and coin.

2	"Lobbyist." As defined in section 13A03 (relating to
3	definitions).
4	* * *
5	"Person." A business, governmental body, individual,
6	including an individual lobbyist or employee of a lobbyist,
7	corporation, union, association, firm, partnership, committee,
8	club or other organization or group of persons.
9	* * *
10	Section 2. Title 65 is amended by adding sections to read:
11	<u>§ 1103.1. Gift ban.</u>
12	Except as provided in section 1103.2 (relating to gift ban
13	exceptions), no public official, public employee or nominee or
14	candidate for public office may receive, accept, take, seek or
15	solicit any of the following:
16	(1) A gift, other than a gift of cash, having either a
17	fair market value or aggregate actual cost greater than \$50
18	<u>from any one person in a calendar year.</u>
19	(2) Hospitality, transportation or lodging having either
20	<u>a fair market value or aggregate actual cost greater than</u>
21	<u>\$500 from any one person in a calendar year.</u>
22	(3) A gift of cash.
23	<u>§ 1103.2. Gift ban exceptions.</u>
24	The prohibitions listed in section 1103.1 (relating to gift
25	ban) shall not apply to any of the following:
26	(1) A gift or any hospitality, transportation or lodging
27	from any of the following:
28	(i) A parent, sibling, spouse, child, stepchild,
29	stepparent, stepsibling, grandparent, grandchild, parent-
30	in-law, sibling-in-law or other family member or friend

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1	when the circumstances make it clear that the motivation
2	for the gift or hospitality, transportation or lodging
3	was a personal or family relationship. The exception
4	under this subparagraph does not apply to a gift of cash
5	to a nominee or candidate for public office. For the
6	purposes of this subparagraph, the term "friend" does not
7	include a registered lobbyist or an employee of a
8	registered lobbyist.
9	(ii) A registered lobbyist or employee of a
10	registered lobbyist if the public official, public
11	employee or nominee or candidate for public office who
12	receives the gift or hospitality, transportation or
13	lodging is involved in a personal romantic relationship
14	with the registered lobbyist or employee of a registered
15	lobbyist and the circumstances make it clear that the
16	motivation for the gift or hospitality, transportation or
17	lodging is related to the personal romantic relationship.
18	The exception under this subparagraph does not apply to a
19	gift of cash to a nominee or candidate for public office.
20	(2) A "contribution," as defined in section 1621 of the
21	act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the
22	Pennsylvania Election Code, lawfully made under that act.
23	(3) Informational material sent to the office of a
24	public official or public employee in the form of a book,
25	article, periodical, other written material, audiotape,
26	videotape or other forms of communication for
27	nonentertainment purposes.
28	(4) An award or prize given to competitors in a contest
29	or event open to the public, including random drawings.
30	(5) An honorary degree or award and associated travel,

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1	food, refreshments and entertainment provided in the
2	presentation of the degree or award.
3	(6) Training provided to a public official or public
4	employee if the training is in the interest of a governmental
5	entity. This paragraph shall include food and refreshments
6	furnished to all attendees as an integral part of the
7	training.
8	(7) Food and beverage for consumption at any of the
9	following:
10	(i) A public event, including a public meeting.
11	(ii) An event directly related to the duties and
12	responsibilities of a public official or public employee.
13	(iii) An event where a public official or public
14	employee is a speaker or a member of a panel.
15	(iv) A regularly scheduled event sponsored by a
16	constituent, Statewide organization or nonprofit
17	organization.
18	(8) Gifts exchanged between public officials or public
19	employees and their staffs on a voluntary basis.
20	(9) An educational mission, including a meeting with
21	governmental officials, either foreign or domestic, intended
22	to educate a public official or public employee on matters of
23	public policy, to which the public official or public
24	employee may be invited to participate along with other
25	Federal, State or local public officials or community
26	leaders.
27	(10) Anything paid for by a Federal, State or other
28	government or governmental entity under a government
29	contract.
30	(11) An honorarium, including an award, plaque, trophy
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1 or other item, valued at \$100 or less that is substantially 2 commemorative in nature. 3 (12) Tokens having de minimis economic impact, such as a greeting card, pen, cap or t-shirt. 4 (13) Light food or refreshments, such as hors d'oeuvres, 5 in a group setting and intended for mass consumption and not 6 7 intended for consumption by a specific individual. 8 (14) Complimentary attendance and food or beverage at a 9 bona fide charitable or political event. 10 (15) Reimbursement of expenses by a governmental body or by an organization or association of public officials or 11 12 employees of political subdivisions, which a public official 13 or public employee serves in an official capacity. 14 Section 3. Section 1105(b)(6) and (7) of Title 65 are 15 amended and the subsection is amended by adding a paragraph to 16 read: § 1105. Statement of financial interests. 17 * * * 18 19 (b) Required information. -- The statement shall include the 20 following information for the prior calendar year with regard to 21 the person required to file the statement: * * * 2.2 The name and address of the source and the amount of 23 (6) 24 any gift or gifts valued in the aggregate at [\$250 or more] 25 \$50 and the circumstances of each gift. This paragraph shall 26 not apply to a gift [or gifts received from a spouse, parent, parent by marriage, sibling, child, grandchild, other family 27 28 member or friend when the circumstances make it clear that the motivation for the action was a personal or family 29 relationship. However, for the purposes of this paragraph, 30

4	(7) The name and address of the source and the amount of
5	any payment for or reimbursement of actual expenses for
6	transportation [and], lodging or hospitality [received in
7	connection with public office or employment where such actual
8	expenses for transportation and lodging or hospitality exceed
9	\$650 in an aggregate amount per year.] valued in the
10	aggregate at \$500 and the circumstances surrounding the
11	payment or reimbursement. This paragraph shall not apply to
12	[expenses reimbursed by a governmental body or to expenses
13	reimbursed by an organization or association of public
14	officials or employees of political subdivisions which the
15	public official or employee serves in an official capacity.]
