## AN ACT

20	certain departments, boards and commissions shall be
21	determined," in administrative organization, further
22	providing for departmental administrative boards, commissions
23	and offices and for advisory boards and commissions; in
24	organization of departmental administrative boards and
25	commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, repealing
26	provisions relating to State Art Commission and further
27	providing for advisory boards and commissions; and, in powers
28 29	and duties of the Department of Public Welfare and its departmental administrative and advisory boards and
29 30	commissions, repealing provisions relating to powers and
31	duties of the State Board of Public Welfare and further
32	providing for the powers and duties of advisory committees.

9	Section 203. Advisory Boards and CommissionsThe following
10	advisory boards and commissions are placed in and made parts of
11	the respective administrative departments, as follows:

30	Section 2. Section 447 of the act is repealed:
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1 [Section 447. State Art Commission.--The State Art 2 Commission shall consist of five citizens of this Commonwealth, 3 of whom the Governor shall designate one as chairman, and another as secretary of the commission who need not be a member 4 thereof. 5 6 Three members shall constitute a quorum.] 7 Section 3. Section 448(k) and (1) of the act are amended to 8 read: 9 Section 448. Advisory Boards and Commissions. -- The advisory 10 boards and commissions, within the several administrative departments, shall be constituted as follows: 11 \* \* \* 12 13 [(k) The State Board of Public Welfare is hereby created. The board shall consist of the Secretary of Public Welfare, ex 14 officio, and sixteen (16) members appointed by the Governor. 15 16 Four (4) members shall be appointed from among the members of the General Assembly, two (2) from the Senate and two (2) from 17 18 the House of Representatives. These members of the board shall, 19 with respect to each branch of the General Assembly, be from different political parties, and they shall, in no event, retain 20 membership on the board after they cease to be members of the 21 branch of the Legislature from which they were appointed. One 22 23 (1) member shall be appointed by the Governor from each of the 24 six (6) advisory committees created by clause (1) of this 25 section, and the first member of each advisory committee appointed by the Governor shall automatically become a member of 26 the board. The term of office of each member of the board, 27 28 except as herein otherwise provided, shall be six (6) years. 29 In the original appointment of the members of the board, six 30 (6) members shall be appointed for the term of six (6) years,

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five (5) members for the term of four (4) years, and five (5) 1 2 members for the term of two (2) years. Any vacancy occurring in 3 the membership of the board shall be filled by the Governor only for the unexpired term. The Governor may remove any member of 4 the board at any time. No member of the board shall serve more 5 than two (2) consecutive terms not including a vacancy 6 7 appointment, nor shall any member hold office in any political 8 party. 9 Nine (9) members of the board shall constitute a quorum. A 10 chairman who shall not be a member of an advisory committee 11 shall be elected by the board, annually, from among its members. 12 Members of the board shall serve without compensation other than 13 reimbursement of travel and other actual expenses incurred in 14 the performance of their duties. The board shall meet at least six (6) times a year. Special meetings of the board shall be 15 16 held on call of the chairman or the Secretary of Public Welfare, and it shall be the duty of the chairman to call a special 17 18 meeting upon the written request of one-third (1/3) or more 19 members, not including vacancies, of the board.] 20 The following advisory committees are hereby created: (1) 21 Advisory Committee for the Blind, 22 Advisory Committee for General and Special Hospitals, 23 Advisory Committee for Children and Youth, 24 Advisory Committee for Public Assistance, 25 Advisory Committee for Mental Health and Mental Retardation. 26 Each advisory committee shall consist of the Commissioner in 27 the Department of Public Welfare, directing the program to which 28 the advisory committee is attached, as an ex officio member, and not less than three (3) nor more than nine (9) members appointed 29 30 by the Governor. In the case of the Advisory Committee for

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Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the committee shall 1 2 include the Chairman of the Public Health and Welfare Committee 3 of the Senate, the Chairman of the Health and Welfare Committee of the House of Representatives and the President of the 4 5 Pennsylvania State Association of County Commissioners or his alternate. The exact number of members of each advisory 6 7 committee shall be determined by the Governor [upon 8 recommendation of the State Board of Public Welfare]. The qualifications of the members of each advisory committee shall 9 10 also be determined by the Governor [upon recommendation of the State Board of Public Welfare]: Provided, That with respect to 11 each advisory committee, the Governor shall appoint members with 12 13 due regard for representation of the professional and lay groups 14 concerned with the fields of interest served by the program to 15 which each advisory committee is attached. The term of office of 16 each member of each advisory committee, except as herein otherwise provided, shall be six (6) years. 17

The original appointment of the members of the advisory committee shall be for overlapping terms of six (6), four (4) and two (2) years. In making these original appointments, the Governor shall, in so far as possible, appoint approximately one-third (1/3) of the recommended complement of each advisory board to each of the overlapping terms.

A majority of the members of each advisory committee shall constitute a quorum. Each advisory committee shall elect a chairman from among its members. Each advisory committee shall meet at least four (4) times a year. Special meetings of each advisory committee shall be held on call of the chairman, and it shall be the duty of the chairman to call a special meeting upon the written request of one-third (1/3) or more of the members

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1 not including vacancies of the advisory committee.

The provisions of clause (k) of this section with respect to filling of vacancies, removal of members, length of service, political party office and compensation shall be applicable to advisory committee members, and are incorporated herein by reference.

8 Section 4. Section 2327 of the act is repealed: [Section 2327. Powers and Duties of the State Board of 9 Public Welfare. -- The State Board of Public Welfare shall be an 10 advisory body to, and a consultative body of the Department of 11 Public Welfare with no power to approve or disapprove rules or 12 13 regulations, and shall have the power and its duty shall be: 14 (a) To participate in the development of broad outlines, of policy and in the formulation of long-range programs and 15 16 objectives of the Department of Public Welfare, 17 To interpret such programs and objectives to the public, (b) 18 and 19 (C) To advise the Secretary of Public Welfare, the Governor and the General Assembly, with respect to the policies, 20 programs, objectives and functioning of the Department of Public 21

22 Welfare.]

23 Section 5. Section 2328(d) of the act is amended to read: 24 Section 2328. Powers and Duties of Advisory Committees.--The 25 Advisory Committee for the Blind, the Advisory Committee for 26 General and Special Hospitals, the Advisory Committee for Children and Youth, the Advisory Committee for Public Assistance 27 28 and the Advisory Committee for Mental Health and Mental 29 Retardation, shall, concerning matters within their respective special fields of interest, have the power and their duty shall 30

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1 be:

3 (d) To make recommendations to the [State Board of Public 4 Welfare] <u>Secretary of Human Services</u> on matters referred to the 5 committees for consideration and advice, or as may be required 6 to promote the effectiveness of the programs, of the 7 departmental units advised by them.

8 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
