AN ACT

1 2 3	Establishing the Long-Term Care Facility Personal Protective Equipment Reimbursement Grant Program and imposing duties on the Department of Aging.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Long-Term
8	Care Facility Personal Protective Equipment Reimbursement Grant
9	Program Act.
10	Section 2. Definitions.
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Applicant." A facility applying for a grant under the
15	program.
16	"Care." Services provided to meet an older adult's needs for
17	personal care or health care which require interaction with the
18	older adult.

1 "Care-dependent individual." An adult who, due to physical 2 or cognitive disability or impairment, requires assistance to 3 meet needs for food, shelter, clothing, personal care or health 4 care.

5 "Department." The Department of Aging of the Commonwealth.6 "Eligible PPE costs." Costs that are both:

7 (1) incurred by a facility in purchasing PPE for use by
8 its employees; and

9 (2) paid by the applicant during the period specified in 10 the standards and requirements for the program as published 11 by the department.

12 "Employee." An individual who:

(1) is employed by a facility, or the affiliated corporate entity of a facility, or enters into a contractual relationship with a facility, an older adult, an older adult's family, agent, legal representative or the affiliated corporate entity of a facility, to provide care to an older adult;

19 (2) has unsupervised access to another individual and 20 that individual's living quarters, resources or personal 21 records; or

(3) is a student doing an internship or clinical
rotation or any other individual who has been granted access
to a facility or older adult to perform a clinical service
for a fee.

26 "Facility." Any of the following:

(1) A domiciliary care home as defined in section 2202-A
of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The
Administrative Code of 1929.

30 (2) Any of the following entities as defined in section 20200HB2509PN3747 - 2 - 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as
 the Health Care Facilities Act:

3 (i) A home health care agency.

4 (ii) A long-term care nursing facility.

5 (iii) A hospice.

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(iv) A home care agency.

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(v) A home care registry.

8 (3) An older adult daily living center as defined in
9 section 2 of the act of July 11, 1990 (P.L.499, No.118),
10 known as the Older Adult Daily Living Centers Licensing Act.

11 (4) A personal care home as defined in section 1001 of 12 the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human 13 Services Code.

14 (5) An assisted living residence as defined in section15 1001 of the Human Services Code.

16 (6) A PACE provider as defined in section 1894 of the
17 Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.).

18 (7) Any other public or private organization, or entity 19 or part of an organization or entity, that uses public funds 20 and is paid, in part, to provide care to care-dependent 21 individuals.

Personal protective equipment" or "PPE." Gloves, respirators, face masks, gowns, face shields and other protective equipment designed to be worn by individuals to prevent or contain contact with, or to prevent transmission of, a communicable illness or the pathogens that cause communicable illness.

28 "Program." The Long-Term Care Facility Personal Protective 29 Equipment Reimbursement Grant Program established under section 30 3.

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"Secretary." The Secretary of Aging of the Commonwealth.
 Section 3. Long-Term Care Facility Personal Protective

Equipment Reimbursement Grant Program.

4 (a) Establishment.--The Long-Term Care Facility Personal
5 Protective Equipment Reimbursement Grant Program is established
6 and shall be administered by the department.

7 (b) Availability.--Grants under the program shall only be 8 offered in a fiscal year in which funding is made available to 9 the department for the program. The following shall apply:

10 (1) If funding is exhausted or otherwise unavailable,
11 the department shall be under no obligation to provide grants
12 under the program.

13 (2) The standards and requirements for the award of 14 grants under the program shall be established by order of the 15 secretary. The secretary shall transmit notice of the order 16 to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the 17 Pennsylvania Bulletin.

(3) Grant money may be prorated or offered as a
percentage of actual costs, as determined by the department
and provided in the order under paragraph (2), to spread
available money to a larger number of grant recipients.
(c) Grant limitations.--In addition to any limitation placed
upon grants in the standards and requirements for the program
under subsection (b) (2), the following shall apply:

(1) Grant money shall only be used to reimburse eligible
PPE costs. The amount of reimbursement shall be based on
eligible PPE costs incurred by an applicant during any fiscal
year, or portion of the costs, in which grants are offered.
(2) Grant reimbursement money shall not exceed the
lesser of 50% of the eligible PPE purchase costs or a lower

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1 amount consistent with the standards and requirements for the 2 program under subsection (b)(2).

3 (3) Grant money may not be used to reimburse any portion
4 of the eligible PPE costs which are being paid or reimbursed
5 under another Federal or State grant program.

Application procedure. -- A facility shall submit a grant 6 (d) 7 application on a form provided by the department, unless 8 otherwise prescribed in the standards and requirements under subsection (b)(2). The department may require that all 9 10 applicants submit applications via an online application system 11 and shall provide the details of the online application process. 12 (e) Application contents. -- The application shall contain the 13 following information and other information as required by the 14 department:

15 (1) The applicant's name, business address and contact 16 information.

17 (2) A detailed statement of the PPE costs, which must
18 include copies of paid invoices clearly identifying the items
19 purchased in enough detail to demonstrate the items are PPE.

20 (3) Other information as the department may reasonably21 require.

(f) Grant awards.--The department shall award grants to applicants in accordance with this section and the applicable program standards and requirements.

25 Section 4. Funding.

The department shall use money as appropriated by the General Assembly for grants under this act and may use any other money that is made available to the department for grants under the program by Federal or State appropriations, donations or from any other source.

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- 1 Section 5. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect immediately.
