14	(P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, is
15	amended by adding a subsection to read:
16	Section 29. License without restriction.

18	(e) National criminal history record check
19	(1) An applicant for an initial license to practice
20	medicine and surgery without restriction in this Commonwealth
21	shall request and submit to the board the results of a

1 national criminal history record check. The purpose of the

2 national criminal history record check shall be to assist the

3 board in obtaining information that may relate to the

4 <u>applicant's fitness for licensure.</u>

(2) An applicant for an initial license to practice

medicine and surgery shall submit to fingerprinting by the

Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent of the

Pennsylvania State Police. The Pennsylvania State Police or

an authorized agent shall submit the fingerprints to the

Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purposes of obtaining

records of criminal arrests and convictions.

the State of Principal License in accordance with the act of October 26, 2016 (P.L.891, No.112), known as the Interstate

Medical Licensure Compact Act, shall submit to fingerprinting by the Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent of the Pennsylvania State Police. The Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent shall submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purposes of obtaining records of criminal arrests and convictions to verify eligibility under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Act. This paragraph shall not be construed to permit records obtained by the national criminal history record check to be submitted to the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact.

(4) In addition to the application fee, the applicant shall be responsible for any fees required by the

Pennsylvania State Police or an authorized agent for the costs of the fingerprinting and the costs of conducting a complete criminal history record check. The applicant shall authorize the release of all records obtained by the criminal

2	(5) A criminal record check submitted in support of an
3	application for licensure must have been requested by the
4	applicant no earlier than 12 months immediately prior to the
5	board's receipt of the applicant's application for licensure
6	(6) Information obtained from the criminal history
7	record check:
8	(i) Is confidential.
9	(ii) May not be redisseminated.
10	(iii) May be used only for the licensing purpose
11	authorized by this act.
12	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
