AN ACT

- 1 Providing for a meal or rest period for employees after working 2 a specified number of hours.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Rest Period
- 7 for Workers Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Employer." An individual, partnership, association,
- 13 corporation, business trust, or person or group of persons
- 14 acting, directly or indirectly, in the interest of an employer
- 15 in relation to an employee. The term does not include police and
- 16 fire departments, public ambulance or providers of emergency
- 17 medical services.

- 1 "Place of business." A store, factory, office or other area
- 2 where an employee works.
- 3 Section 3. Five-hour work periods, 30-minute meal or 30-minute
- 4 rest periods between work periods.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- No employer may employ or permit an
- 6 individual to work for more than five hours continuously in or
- 7 in connection with a place of business without a meal or rest
- 8 period of at least 30 minutes, which period shall not be
- 9 considered a part of the hours of labor, and no period of less
- 10 than 30 minutes shall be deemed to interrupt a continuous period
- 11 of work.
- 12 (b) Location of meal and rest periods. -- No employer shall
- 13 require an employee to remain in a workroom or at the employee's
- 14 work station during the meal or rest periods required under this
- 15 section. If the strict application of the 30-minute meal or 30-
- 16 minute rest periods impose an unnecessary hardship on an
- 17 employer and the employee or a limitation on the job
- 18 opportunities of an employee, the Secretary of Labor and
- 19 Industry may grant upon written application of the employer an
- 20 exception from compliance with this section.
- 21 Section 4. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
