A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of January 2019 as "Radon Action Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The United States Surgeon General and a consortium
- 4 of health agencies throughout the United States have joined
- 5 forces to promote awareness of the leading cause of lung cancer
- 6 for nonsmokers; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The American Lung Association, the Centers for
- 8 Disease Control and Prevention and the National Cancer Institute
- 9 all agree that radon is a national health problem and encourage
- 10 radon testing of housing during an awareness drive this January;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, Radon is a naturally occurring, invisible and
- 13 odorless radioactive gas not isolated to certain geographical
- 14 areas or housing types, and radon problems have been detected in
- 15 homes in every county in the United States; and
- 16 WHEREAS, One in fifteen American homes contains high levels

- 1 of radon, exposing millions of Americans to this dangerous gas;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, If a home has not been tested for radon in the past
- 4 two years, the Surgeon General and the Environmental Protection
- 5 Agency urge household residents to locate a qualified radon test
- 6 kit or a qualified radon testing company and test their
- 7 residence for radon; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The month of January 2019 has been targeted as
- 9 "Radon Action Month" nationally, and educational information
- 10 about radon may be obtained at www.RadonWeek.org; therefore be
