A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of May 2019 as "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Most people do not realize that the skin is the
- 4 largest and most visible organ of the body and performs many
- 5 essential tasks, such as regulating body temperature, protecting
- 6 internal organs, providing sensation and supporting metabolic
- 7 functions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to current estimates, one in five
- 9 Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime; and
- 10 WHEREAS, More than 3 million cases of nonmelanoma skin cancer
- 11 are diagnosed in the United States each year; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Recent estimates show there will be 192,310 new
- 13 cases of melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer, diagnosed
- 14 in the United States each year; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Melanoma is the most common form of cancer for young

- 1 adults between 25 and 29 years of age and the second most common
- 2 form of cancer for adolescents and young adults between 15 and
- 3 29 years of age; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Melanoma and other skin cancers are highly treatable
- 5 if detected early; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Sun exposure is the most preventable risk factor for
- 7 all skin cancers, including melanoma; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 9 month of May 2019 as "Melanoma and Skin Cancer Detection and
- 10 Prevention Month" in Pennsylvania.
