A RESOLUTION

- Urging the licensing boards and commissions under the Department of State to review how military education and training may partially or completely fulfill licensure requirements and to 3 develop suggested pathways to licensure for active duty military and veterans. 5 6 WHEREAS, The Department of State, Bureau of Professional and 7 Occupational Affairs, oversees 29 licensing boards and commissions that together license more than 1 million 8 9 Pennsylvanians; and 10 WHEREAS, There are more than 800,000 veterans living in Pennsylvania; and 11 12 WHEREAS, About 57% of veterans across the United States have difficulty adjusting to civilian life and 80% do not have a job 13 14 when they leave the military; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Organizations, including the National Conference of
- 16 State Legislatures and the United States Department of Labor,
- 17 report that veterans who have training and experience in areas
- 18 related to civilian licensure often find that institutions of

- 1 higher education and licensing boards may not recognize official
- 2 documentation of military training and experience; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Over the past few years, several states, including
- 4 Oklahoma, New York, Maine, Rhode Island and Vermont, have
- 5 considered and enacted legislation to require licensing boards,
- 6 under appropriate circumstances, to accept and recognize
- 7 military training and experience toward licensure requirements
- 8 in related occupations; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania should be a national leader in the
- 10 effort to ease the transition between military and civilian
- 11 life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes its role in
- 13 promoting family-sustaining employment for our brave veterans
- 14 who have put their lives on the line to serve our Commonwealth
- 15 and our country; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge each of the
- 17 licensing boards and commissions under the Department of State,
- 18 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, to review how
- 19 military education and training may partially or completely
- 20 fulfill licensure requirements, develop suggested pathways to
- 21 licensure for veterans and otherwise encourage licensure among
- 22 veterans in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the licensing boards and commissions under the
- 24 Department of State, Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 25 Affairs, be urged to consult and collaborate with the Department
- 26 of Defense and the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs
- 27 in reviewing how military education and training may partially
- 28 or completely fulfill licensure requirements, developing
- 29 suggested pathways to licensure for veterans and otherwise
- 30 encouraging licensure among veterans in this Commonwealth.
