## AN ACT

11	Section 1. Article XIII-C heading and sections 1301-C, 1302-

1 0	Section 1301-C Definitions

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 2 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 <u>"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and</u>
- 5 Delinguency.
- 6 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 7 Commonwealth.
- 8 "Independent contractor." An individual, including a retired
- 9 Federal agent or retired State, municipal or military police
- 10 <u>officer or retired sheriff or deputy sheriff, whose</u>
- 11 responsibilities, including work hours, are established in a
- 12 written contract with a school entity or a nonpublic school for
- 13 the purpose of performing school security services.
- "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
- 15 vocational-technical school, charter school or private
- 16 residential rehabilitative institution.
- "School police officer." Any of the following:
- 18 <u>(1)</u> A law <u>enforcement</u> officer employed by a school
- 19 [district] entity or nonpublic school whose responsibilities,
- including work hours, are established by the school
- 21 [district] entity or nonpublic school.
- 22 (2) An independent contractor or an individual provided
- 23 <u>through a third-party vendor who has been appointed under</u>
- 24 section 1302-C.
- "School resource officer." A law enforcement officer
- 26 commissioned and employed by a law enforcement agency whose duty
- 27 station is located in a school entity or nonpublic school and
- 28 whose stationing is established by an agreement between the law
- 29 enforcement agency and the school entity[.] or nonpublic school.
- 30 The term includes an active certified sheriff or deputy sheriff

- 1 whose stationing in the school entity or nonpublic school is
- 2 established by a written agreement between the county, the
- 3 sheriff's office and the school entity or nonpublic school.
- 4 "School security guard." An individual employed by a school
- 5 entity, nonpublic school or a [third party contractor] third-
- 6 party vendor or an independent contractor who is assigned to a
- 7 school for routine safety and security duties and [is not
- 8 engaged in programs with students at the school.] has not been
- 9 granted powers under section 1306-C(2) and (3).
- 10 "School security personnel." School police officers, school
- 11 <u>resource officers and school security guards.</u>
- 12 <u>"Third-party vendor." A company or entity approved by the</u>
- 13 Office of Safe Schools under section 1302-A(b)(8) or the
- 14 commission under section 1315-C(2) that provides school security
- 15 services.
- 16 Section 1302-C. School police officers.
- 17 (a) Application to court. -- A school entity or nonpublic
- 18 school may apply to a judge of the court of common pleas of the
- 19 county within which the school entity or nonpublic school is
- 20 situated to appoint a person or persons, as the board of
- 21 directors of the school entity or the administration of the
- 22 nonpublic school may designate, to act as a school police
- 23 officer for the school entity or nonpublic school.
- 24 (b) Appointment.--
- 25 (1) The judge, upon the application, may appoint a
- 26 person or persons, as the judge deems proper, to be the
- 27 school police officer and shall note the fact of the
- appointment to be entered upon the records of the court.
- 29 (2) The judge may, at the request of the school entity
- or nonpublic school, grant the school police officer the

- 1 power to arrest as provided in section 1306-C(2), the
- 2 authority to issue citations for summary offenses as provided
- 3 <u>in section 1306-C(3)</u> or the authority to detain students
- 4 until the arrival of local law enforcement or any combination
- 5 thereof.
- 6 (3) The judge shall, at the request of the school entity
- 7 or nonpublic school, grant the school police officer the
- 8 <u>authority to carry a firearm if the school police officer</u>
- 9 satisfies the requirements under section 1305-C.
- 10 Section 1303-C. Annual report [to department].
- 11 A school entity or nonpublic school which employs or
- 12 <u>contracts for</u> a school police officer shall report annually to
- 13 the department and the [Office of Safe Schools] commission the
- 14 following information regarding school police officers receiving
- 15 training as required under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating
- 16 to municipal police education and training):
- 17 (1) The identity of the school entity or nonpublic
- school and the number of school police officers employed or
- 19 <u>contracted</u> by the school entity or nonpublic school.
- 20 (2) The municipalities comprising the school entity or
- in which the nonpublic school is located.
- 22 (3) The date and type of training provided to each
- 23 school police officer.
- 24 Section 1305-C. [Firearm training] Training.
- 25 A school police officer who has been granted powers under
- 26 section 1306-C(2) or (3) or has been authorized to carry a
- 27 firearm must, before entering upon the duties of the office,
- 28 [successfully] satisfy the following:
- 29 <u>(1) Successfully complete such annual</u> training as [set
- forth in required by the Municipal Police Officers'

2 Subch. D (relating to municipal police education and

3 training) or [have] has graduated from the Pennsylvania State

4 Police Academy [and have], has been employed as a State

- 7 (2) (i) Successfully complete the Basic School Resource
  8 Officer Course of Instruction offered by the National
  9 Association of School Resource Officers or an equivalent
  10 course of instruction approved by the commission.
- 11 (ii) A school police officer who is currently

  12 employed or contracted by a school entity or nonpublic

  13 school shall have six months from the effective date of

  14 this paragraph to complete the instruction.
- 15 Section 1306-C. Powers and duties.
- A school police officer appointed under section 1302-C(b)
- 17 shall possess and exercise all the following powers and duties:
- 18 (1) To enforce good order in school buildings, on school
- buses and on school grounds in the respective school entities
- or nonpublic schools. For purposes of this paragraph, the
- term "school bus" shall include a vehicle leased by the
- 22 school entity or nonpublic school to transport students and a
- vehicle of mass transit used by students to go to and from
- 24 school and school activities when the school police officer
- responds to a report of an incident involving a breach of
- 26 good order or violation of law.
- 27 (2) If authorized by the court, to exercise the same
- powers as exercised under authority of law or ordinance by
- 29 the police of the municipality in which the school property
- 30 is located.

- 1 (3) If authorized by the court, to issue summary
- 2 citations or to detain individuals until local law
- 3 enforcement is notified.
- 4 Section 1309-C. Cooperative police service agreements.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- A school entity or nonpublic school and
- 6 municipality may enter into a cooperative police service
- 7 agreement under 42 Pa.C.S. § 8953(e) (relating to Statewide
- 8 municipal police jurisdiction) and 53 Pa.C.S. § 2303 (relating
- 9 to intergovernmental cooperation authorized) to authorize the
- 10 exercise of concurrent jurisdiction with local law enforcement
- 11 within the municipality where the [school or] school entity or
- 12 nonpublic school is located or within the municipality in which
- 13 a school event or activity will take place.
- 14 (b) Municipalities without municipal police departments.--
- 15 (1) If a school entity or nonpublic school is located
- within a municipality where no municipal police department
- exists, the school entity or nonpublic school may enter into
- 18 a cooperative police service agreement under 42 Pa.C.S. §
- 19 8953(e) and 53 Pa.C.S. § 2303 with a municipality providing
- full-time or part-time police coverage that is located
- 21 adjacent to the school entity or nonpublic school.
- 22 (2) At least 30 days prior to executing a cooperative
- 23 police service agreement under this subsection, the school
- 24 entity or nonpublic school shall provide written notice of
- 25 its intent to enter into the agreement to the municipality
- 26 where the school entity or nonpublic school is located.
- 27 (3) A copy of the executed agreement shall be provided
- to the commanding officer of the Pennsylvania State Police
- 29 installation that provides primary police services to the
- 30 municipality where the school <u>entity or nonpublic school</u> is

- 1 located.
- 2 (4) A cooperative police service agreement entered into
- 3 under this subsection shall only pertain to actions taken on
- 4 school property under the agreement and shall not affect the
- 5 jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 6 Section 1311-C. Independent contractors and third-party
- 7 vendors.
- 8 [Notwithstanding section 1310-C, a school entity or nonpublic
- 9 school may contract with individuals who are retired Federal
- 10 agents or retired State, municipal or military police officers
- 11 or sheriffs to provide services under this article. The
- 12 individuals shall be considered independent contractors of the
- 13 school entity or nonpublic school and shall be compensated by
- 14 the school entity or nonpublic school on an hourly basis and
- 15 receive no other compensation or fringe benefits from the school
- 16 entity or nonpublic school.]
- 17 <u>(a) General rule.--Notwithstanding section 1310-C, a school</u>
- 18 entity or nonpublic school may contract with an independent
- 19 contractor or third-party vendor to provide school police
- 20 officer or school security guard services under this article.
- 21 (b) School police officer services. -- [The school entity or
- 22 nonpublic school shall ensure that the independent contractors
- 23 comply with all of the following :]
- (1) [Completed such annual training as is required by
- the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training
- 26 Commission under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to
- 27 municipal police education and training) Prior to performing
- 28 services for a school entity or nonpublic school, an
- 29 independent contractor or an individual provided through a
- 30 third-party vendor shall complete the training required under

- 1 section 1305-C.
- 2 (2) [Satisfied] Prior to performing services for a
- 3 school entity or nonpublic school, an independent contractor
- 4 <u>or an individual provided through a third-party vendor shall</u>
- 5 <u>satisfy</u> the requirements of [section] <u>sections</u> 111 <u>and 111.1</u>
- and 23 Pa.C.S. § 6344 (relating to employees having contact
- 7 with children; adoptive and foster parents).
- 8 (3) [In the case of a school entity, indemnified by the
- school entity under 42 Pa.C.S. § 8548 (relating to
- indemnity).] If provided in the written contract, an
- independent contractor of a school entity shall be treated as
- 12 <u>an employee of a local agency under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 85 Subch.</u>
- C (relating to actions against local parties).
- 14 (4) An independent contractor of a nonpublic school
- shall be insured by the nonpublic school for any liability
- arising from the performance of the independent contractor's
- duties.
- 18 (c) School security quard services.--
- 19 (1) Prior to performing services for a school entity or
- 20 nonpublic school, an independent contractor or an individual
- 21 provided through a third-party vendor shall complete the
- 22 training required under section 1314-C(b), if applicable.
- 23 (2) Prior to performing services for a school entity or
- 24 <u>nonpublic school, an independent contractor or an individual</u>
- 25 provided through a third-party vendor shall satisfy the
- requirements of sections 111 and 111.1 and 23 Pa.C.S. § 6344.
- 27 (3) If provided in the written contract, an independent
- 28 contractor of a school entity shall be treated as an employee
- of a local agency under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 85 Subch. C.
- 30 (4) An independent contractor of a nonpublic school

- shall be insured by the nonpublic school for any liability
- 2 arising from the performance of the independent contractor's
- 3 duties.
- 4 Section 1313-C. School resource officers.
- 5 (a) Powers and duties. -- A school entity or nonpublic school
- 6 may confer the following powers and duties upon school resource
- 7 officers:
- 8 (1) To assist in the identification of physical changes
- 9 in the environment which may reduce crime in or around the
- 10 school.
- 11 (2) To assist in developing school policy which
- 12 addresses crime and to recommend procedural changes.
- 13 (3) To develop and educate students in crime prevention
- 14 and safety.
- 15 (4) To train students in conflict resolution,
- 16 restorative justice and crime awareness.
- 17 (5) To address crime and violence issues, gangs and drug
- activities affecting or occurring in or around a school.
- 19 (6) To develop or expand community justice initiatives
- 20 for students.
- 21 (a.1) Training.--
- 22 (1) Prior to entering upon the duties of the office, a
- 23 <u>school resource officer shall successfully complete the Basic</u>
- School Resource Officer Course of Instruction offered by the
- 25 <u>National Association of School Resource Officers or an</u>
- 26 equivalent course of instruction approved by the commission.
- 27 (2) A school resource officer who is currently employed
- by, and whose duty station is located in a school entity or
- 29 nonpublic school shall have six months from the effective
- 30 date of this subsection to complete the instruction.

- 1 (b) Intergovernmental agreements for school [security and
- 2 safety] resource officers.--
- 3 (1) The board of school directors of a school district
- 4 may enter into agreements with other political subdivisions
- 5 to provide for [the safety and security of the] school
- 6 <u>resource officers, subject to the statutory authority of</u>
- 7 school resource officers.
- 8 (2) The board of school directors may use school funds
- 9 to share costs with municipalities and counties for such
- 10 expenses as benefits and salaries of school resource officers
- 11 [and probation officers].
- 12 <u>(3)</u> School resource officers [and probation officers]
- are not required to be employees of the school district and
- may be employees of other political subdivisions.
- 15 Section 1314-C. School security guards.
- 16 (a) Scope of services. -- A school security quard may provide
- 17 the following services as determined by the school entity or
- 18 nonpublic school:
- 19 (1) School safety support services.
- 20 (2) Enhanced campus supervision.
- 21 (3) Assistance with disruptive students.
- 22 (4) Monitoring visitors on campus.
- 23 (5) Coordination with law enforcement officials,
- including school police officers and school resource
- 25 officers.
- 26 (6) Security functions which improve and maintain school
- 27 safety.
- 28 (b) Training. -- The following shall apply:
- 29 <u>(1) A school security guard shall successfully complete</u>
- 30 <u>the basic school resource officer course of instruction</u>

- offered by the National Association of School Resource
- 2 Officers or an equivalent course of instruction approved by
- 3 the commission.
- 4 (2) A school security guard who is currently employed or
- 5 <u>contracted by a school entity or nonpublic school shall have</u>
- 6 six months from the effective date of this subsection to
- 7 <u>complete the instruction.</u>
- 8 (c) Armed school security quards. -- A school entity or
- 9 <u>nonpublic school may employ or contract with an independent</u>
- 10 contractor or a third-party vendor under section 1311-C for an
- 11 armed school security guard if all of the following conditions
- 12 are met:
- (1) Except as set forth in subsection (d) or (e), the
- school security guard is licensed under 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61
- Subch. A (relating to Uniform Firearms Act).
- 16 (2) Except as set forth in subsection (d) or (e), the
- 17 school security quard has successfully completed and is
- 18 currently certified under the act of October 10, 1974
- 19 (P.L.705, No.235), known as the Lethal Weapons Training Act.
- 20 (3) The school security guard has complied with training
- requirements under subsection (b).
- 22 (4) The school security guard has satisfied the
- 23 requirements under sections 111 and 111.1 and 23 Pa.C.S. §
- 24 6344 (relating to employees having contact with children;
- adoptive and foster parents).
- 26 (d) Active law enforcement officers. -- Active law enforcement
- 27 <u>officers shall be exempt from the training requirements for</u>
- 28 school security quards under subsection (c)(1) and (2) upon
- 29 presentation to the school entity or nonpublic school of
- 30 evidence of their completion of the training requirements under

- 1 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police
- 2 education and training).
- 3 (e) Retired law enforcement officers.--A retired law
- 4 <u>enforcement officer shall be exempt from the training</u>
- 5 requirements for school security quards under subsection (c)(1)
- 6 and (2) if the retired officer:
- 7 (1) complies with section 8.1 of the Lethal Weapons
- 8 <u>Training Act; or</u>
- 9 (2) has been issued a firearm training and qualification
- 10 card under section 5 of the act of December 13, 2005
- 11 (P.L.432, No.79), known as the Retired Law Enforcement
- 12 <u>Identification Act.</u>
- 13 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections A SECTION <--
- 14 to read:
- 15 Section 1315-C. Duties of the commission.
- 16 The commission shall have the following duties under this
- 17 article:
- 18 (1) In conjunction with the department and the
- 19 Pennsylvania State Police, periodically reassess the training
- 20 <u>requirements for all school security personnel, including the</u>
- 21 Basic School Resource Officer Course of Instruction offered
- 22 <u>by the National Association of School Resource Officers.</u>
- 23 (2) Establish criteria for certifying approved third-
- 24 party vendors to provide school security quard services to
- 25 school entities and nonpublic schools.
- 26 (3) Publish and post on the commission's publicly
- 27 <u>accessible Internet website a listing of all approved third-</u>
- 28 party vendors for school security quard services.
- 29 (4) Submit an annual report to the General Assembly on
- 30 <u>school security</u>, including all data collected from school

- 1 <u>entities and nonpublic schools and recommendations for</u>
- 2 improvements in school security personnel training
- 3 <u>requirements.</u>
- 4 <u>Section 1316 C. Authority to possess a firearm.</u>

- 5 This article provides the exclusive means for a school entity
- 6 <u>or nonpublic school to authorize school security personnel to</u>
- 7 possess a firearm on school premises.
- 8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
