A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the impact of COVID-19 on education in this Commonwealth and to issue a report.
- 4 WHEREAS, The health and safety of students in this
- 5 Commonwealth is an utmost priority; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The necessary response to the COVID-19 pandemic has
- 7 required schools at all levels to provide instruction remotely
- 8 on a full-time or part-time basis; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While remote learning instruction is preferable to
- 10 no instruction, the schools in this Commonwealth have varying
- 11 levels of ability and effectiveness in providing remote
- 12 instruction; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Where the instruction is not effective, loss of
- 14 learning for students may result in many students being
- 15 significantly behind and in need of extensive remediation; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Such loss of learning at all levels of education in
- 17 this Commonwealth has the potential to adversely affect the
- 18 learning of each student and this Commonwealth as a whole;
- 19 therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Legislative Budget and
- 2 Finance Committee to study the impact of COVID-19 on education
- 3 in this Commonwealth and to issue a report; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the study include an analysis of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (1) the changes to education in preschools and
- 7 kindergarten through grade twelve schools as a result of the
- 8 COVID-19 pandemic;
- 9 (2) the necessary changes following the COVID-19
- 10 pandemic to address the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on
- 11 student education at all levels;
- 12 (3) the impact on the economy that results from the loss
- of an entire generation of learners if the education lost
- during the COVID-19 pandemic is not remedied;
- 15 (4) the degree and type of loss of learning that
- occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic;
- 17 (5) any demographic group that has experienced losses of
- 18 learning during the COVID-19 pandemic;
- 19 (6) the effect of the loss of learning in each
- demographic group and this Commonwealth, if the loss of
- learning during the COVID-19 pandemic is not remedied;
- 22 (7) the types of corrective measures or changes that
- 23 could be utilized now to address the loss of learning;
- 24 (8) the types of corrective measures or changes to
- 25 address the loss of learning that would be needed later if no
- 26 corrective measures or changes are implemented now; and
- 27 (9) the actions that other states are initiating in
- terms of loss of learning;
- 29 and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That, in conducting the study, the Legislative

- 1 Budget and Finance Committee consult with education
- 2 stakeholders, preschool educators and classroom teachers and
- 3 administrators in kindergarten through grade twelve schools,
- 4 both public and nonpublic, in this Commonwealth; and be it
- 5 further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 7 be prohibited from consulting with entities that currently, or
- 8 have the potential to, contract with the Commonwealth in any
- 9 manner related to the study or with any private entity that
- 10 could financially benefit from a policy change that could result
- 11 from the findings or recommendations of the study; and be it
- 12 further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 14 prepare and submit a written report with findings and
- 15 recommendations regarding the study; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the report be submitted to the Senate within
- 17 90 days of the adoption of this resolution.
